WEATHER BRIEF for Tuesday November 09, 2021 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana



Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday November 09, 2021, were available for most of the stations.

The highest rainfall recorded was 28.8 mm at Great Falls in Region 10.

Synopsis: Continual drying of the atmosphere at all levels with significant presence of the Saharan dust and strong mid-upper level shear produced mainly stable conditions across Guyana.

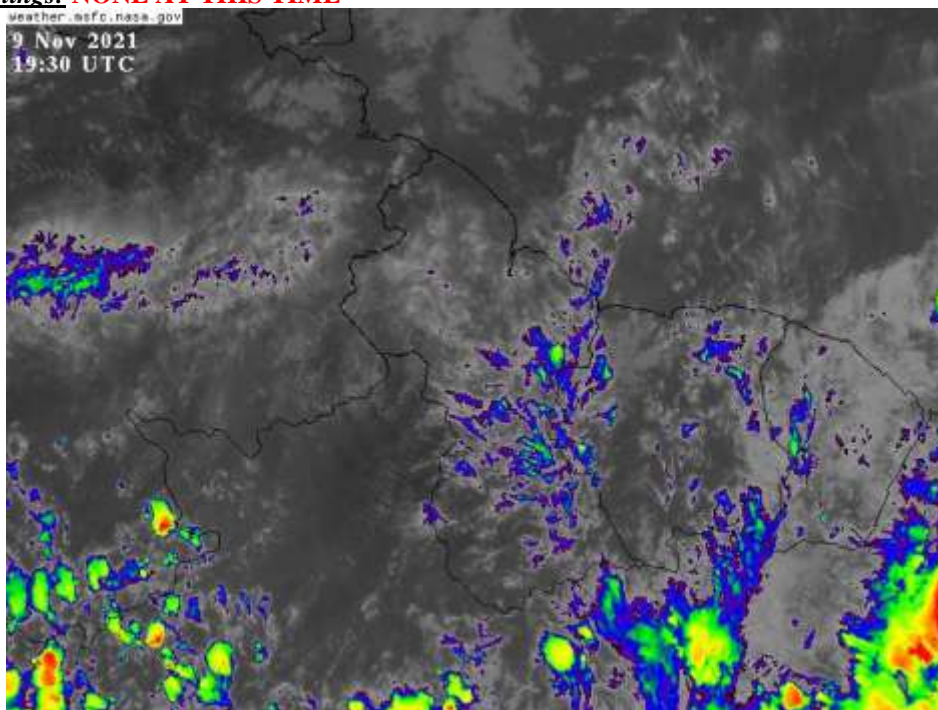
Today's weather review: Fair to partly cloudy skies with a few passing morning showers were observed over inland areas.

HIGH TIDE ADVISORY: Citizens are advised that the above normal high tide advisory is in effect and will end today.

- Waves are likely to have periods of between 10 seconds to 11 seconds.
