WEATHER BRIEF for Sunday 05 April 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Sunday, 05 April 2026, were available for some stations. **Samatta Point Grove (E.B.D) in Region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 114.1mm.**

Synopsis: Mild to moderate instabilities in the lower levels with divergence at the mid and upper levels continue to be the dominant feature. This feature is expected to continue for 12 to 18 hours. Mostly stable conditions are expected to return in the remainder of the week.

Weather review: Cloudy to overcast skies with rain in coastal and near inland areas. Elsewhere, scattered showers.

Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 05 to 14 April 2026, is 3.9m per day. 3 April, 2026

Weather Warning: Soils may already be saturated from continuous rainfall, and given the forecast conditions, which indicate an increased chance of further rainfall, the likelihood of flooding increases significantly in low-lying and poorly drained areas. Hilly areas can also expect possible mudslides during heavy downpours. In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate to rough in open waters with North-easterly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 meters (7 to 10 ft) and increasing.

These waves will likely have periods of 10 and 11 seconds

Winds: Moderate to fresh North-easterly to Easterly breeze.

Tuesday: Early morning, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers along coastal areas. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall. For the remainder of the forecast period, occasional showers in inland areas. In the other areas, no significant rainfall. **Rainfall between 0 and 20mm.**

Wednesday through Saturday: In the early morning, southern Guyana can expect occasional showers and possible thundershowers. Otherwise, partly cloudy skies with no significant rainfall. For the remainder of the forecast period, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers. **Rainfall between 0 and 30mm, the maximum in Southern Guyana.**
