Weather Brief for Sunday, 12 April 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

No significant rainfall was recorded.

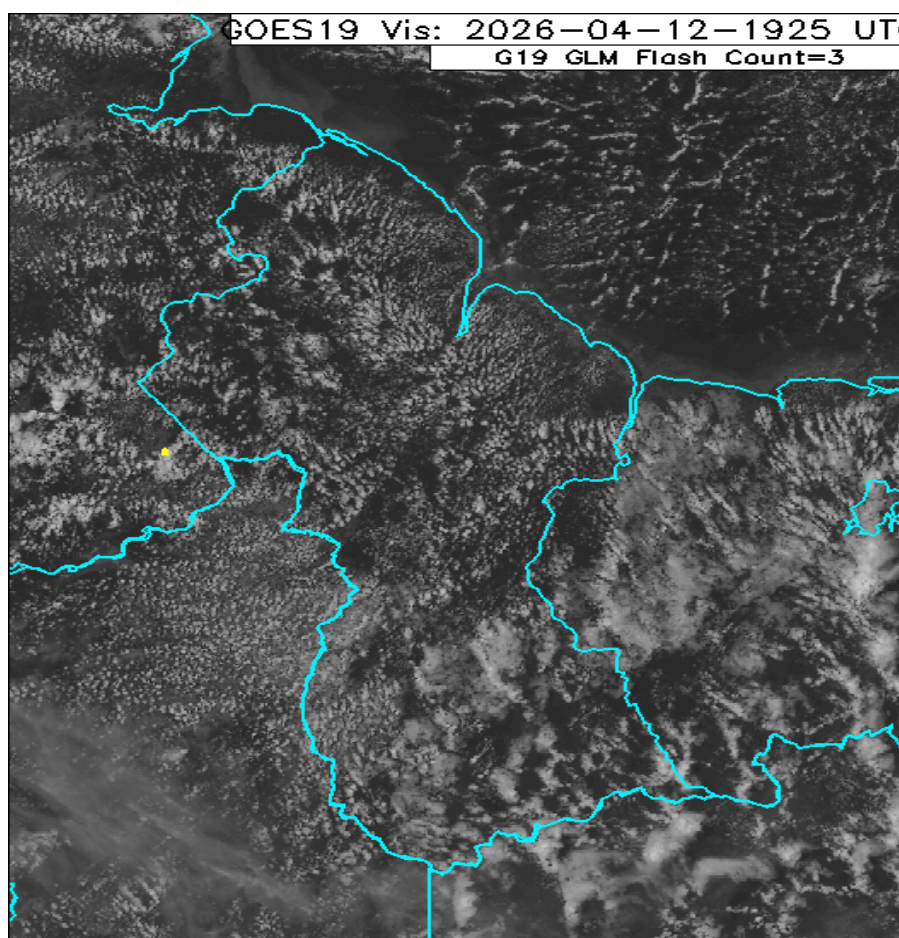
Synopsis: A high-pressure ridge continues to dominate weather conditions across Guyana. However, weak to moderate instabilities are expected to develop by mid-week, which may lead to a gradual increase in rainfall activity.

Today's weather review: Sunny skies were observed with isolated showers.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be moderate with northeasterly swells reaching 1.5 to 2.5 metres (6 to 8 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 8 and 9 seconds.

- Moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday: Cloudy skies with scattered showers. Rainfall is expected between 5 and 15 mm.

Wednesday to Friday, mostly cloudy skies with occasional to intermittent showers. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 30 and 50 mm.

Saturday, sunny skies with possible isolated showers. No significant rainfall is likely.
