**Severe Weather Advisory:** In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes are likely to be observed.

**Weather Brief for Tuesday, 21 April 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.**

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Portage landing in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 16.0 mm.

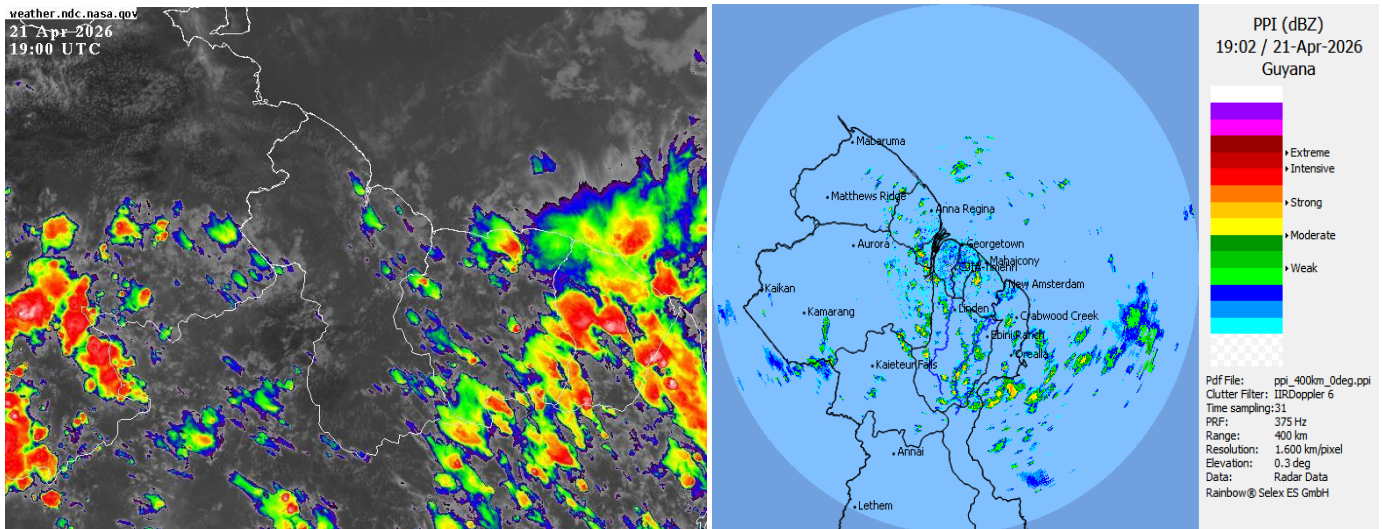
**Synopsis:** Unstable conditions associated with a surface trough are expected to begin affecting Guyana later this evening into the early morning. Thereafter, a gradual strengthening and oscillation of the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) over the country will persist throughout the remainder of the week. These conditions are likely to be further enhanced by strong upper-level divergence.

**Today's weather review:** Partly cloudy skies were observed across Guyana with scattered showers over regions 2 to 6 and 10. All other areas saw isolated showers.

Regions 1 to 10	Rainfall is expected to be between 5 and 20 mm over Regions 7 to 9 and between 20 and 40 mm over coastal areas.	Cloudy skies are expected to persist across Guyana, with scattered showers developing over Regions 7 to 10 during the evening hours. By early morning, coastal areas will become overcast, with frequent moderate to heavy showers and periods of intermittent rain. Additionally, isolated thundershowers are likely over Regions 2 to 4.  <b>Winds:</b> Moderate northeast to easterly breeze becoming windy in the early morning before and during heavy downpours and thundershowers.  <u>Minimum temperatures:</u> Coast: 21 °C – 23 °C Hinterland: 19 °C – 22 °C	Regions 1 to 10	Rainfall is expected to be between 40 and 80 mm, with the highest over Regions 7, 8, and 9.	Mostly cloudy to overcast skies will continue across Guyana with intermittent to continuous showers and rain. Rainfall intensities are expected to be mostly moderate with occasional heavy downpours during the morning across coastal areas and over interior locations from mid-afternoon into early evening.  <b>Winds:</b> Moderate northeast to easterly breeze becoming windy before and during heavy downpours and thundershowers.  <u>Maximum temperatures:</u> Coast: 26 °C – 28 °C Hinterland: 27 °C – 29 °C

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days, April 22, 2026, to May 01, 2026, is 5.0mm per day.

**SPRING TIDE ADVISORY:** Above-normal tidal conditions are expected to persist until tomorrow. Residents are advised to remain alert and exercise caution during this period.

**Sea conditions:**

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with northeasterly swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters (3 to 5 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle northeast to easterly breeze

**Extended Forecast**

**Thursday:** Cloudy skies will continue throughout Guyana. Coastal areas will see scattered to occasional showers during the morning. Interior locations will see thundershowers and rain from the afternoon into the evening. Rainfall is expected to be between 30 and 50 mm over coastal areas and between 50 and 80 mm elsewhere.

**Friday:** Overcast skies with intermittent to continuous showers and rain throughout Guyana. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 60 and 80 mm. There is potential for some areas to report values in excess of 100 mm.

**Saturday:** Cloudy to overcast skies with occasional to intermittent showers over northern Guyana during the morning. Southern Guyana will see scattered showers. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 40 mm over northern Guyana and between 10 and 20 mm over southern Guyana.

**Sunday and Monday:** partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 10 and 25 mm within 24 hours.
