Weather Brief for Thursday, 09 April 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.



Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Aishalton in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 36.9mm.

Synopsis: Weak atmospheric instabilities from the high-pressure ridge are affecting Guyana. This pattern is expected to continue into the weekend.

Today's weather review: A mix of sunshine and clouds with scattered showers over inland and southern Guyana.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be moderate with north to northeasterly swells reaching 1.5 to 2.5 metres (6 to 8 feet) and decreasing.

- Wave periods will range between 8 and 9 seconds.

- Gentle to moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Saturday to Monday: Mostly sunny skies with a few cloudy periods during the morning, with brief to isolated showers. **Rainfall is anticipated to be less than 15 mm within 24 hours.**

Tuesday to Thursday, cloudy to overcast skies with occasional to frequent showers and isolated thunderstorms can be expected across Guyana. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 30 and 70 mm within 24 hours. The highest values will be observed over Regions 6, 10, and 9.
