

Weather Brief for Sunday, 02 August 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Due to technical issues past 24 hours rainfall were unable to be obtained from rainfall stations across Guyana.

Marine Advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding, as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: A tropical wave to the north of Guyana, currently inducing troughs over northern parts of the country, coupled with localized conditions are generating isolated-scattered moderate-strong instabilities. Tonight, into tomorrow, the wave is projected to exit the northern vicinity of Guyana, producing an easterly to southeasterly flow, and as Saharan dust intensifies, ridging and subsidence will likely dominate most levels of the atmosphere, with mostly stable conditions over most of the forecast area.

Today’s weather review: Inland and southern regions observed afternoon cloudy spells with isolated thundershowers and scattered showers. Elsewhere mostly fair and sunny skies were observed.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, August 03 to 10, 2026, is 6.1 mm per day.

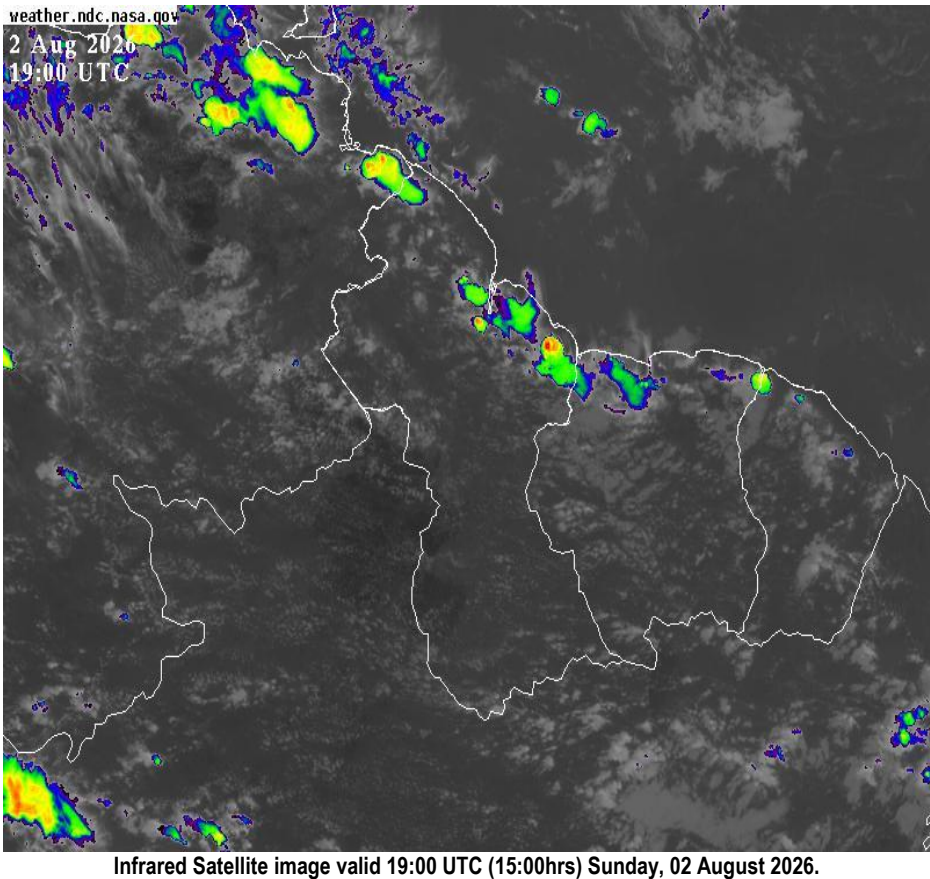

Spring Tide Advisory: The Spring Tide is in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday: Mostly fair and sunny skies likely over coastal Guyana, elsewhere afternoon cloudy spells with scattered showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected not to be significant over coastal Guyana, elsewhere between 0 mm and 15 mm within 24 hours.

Thursday through Friday: Partly cloudy and sunny skies with brief showers likely over coastal Guyana, elsewhere afternoon cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 mm and 10 mm over coastal Guyana, elsewhere between 5 mm and 25 mm within 24 hours.
