

Weather Brief for Tuesday, 04 August 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 04 August 2026 were available for most of the stations. ITUNI in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 33.0 mm.

Marine Advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding, as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: Apart from localized conditions producing isolated instabilities over inland and southern regions in the afternoon, A very dry atmosphere from 700 to 250 hPa, high concentrations of SAL, ridging, and mid-upper-level windshear all dominated and generated mainly stable conditions across Guyana. These conditions are expected to continue for the next 2 days, after which a tropical wave is expected to produce some instabilities mainly in the northern regions of the country.

Today’s weather review: Inland and southern regions observed afternoon cloudy spells with isolated thundershowers and scattered showers. Elsewhere, mostly fair and sunny skies were observed.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, August 05 to 14, 2026, is 5.9 mm per day.

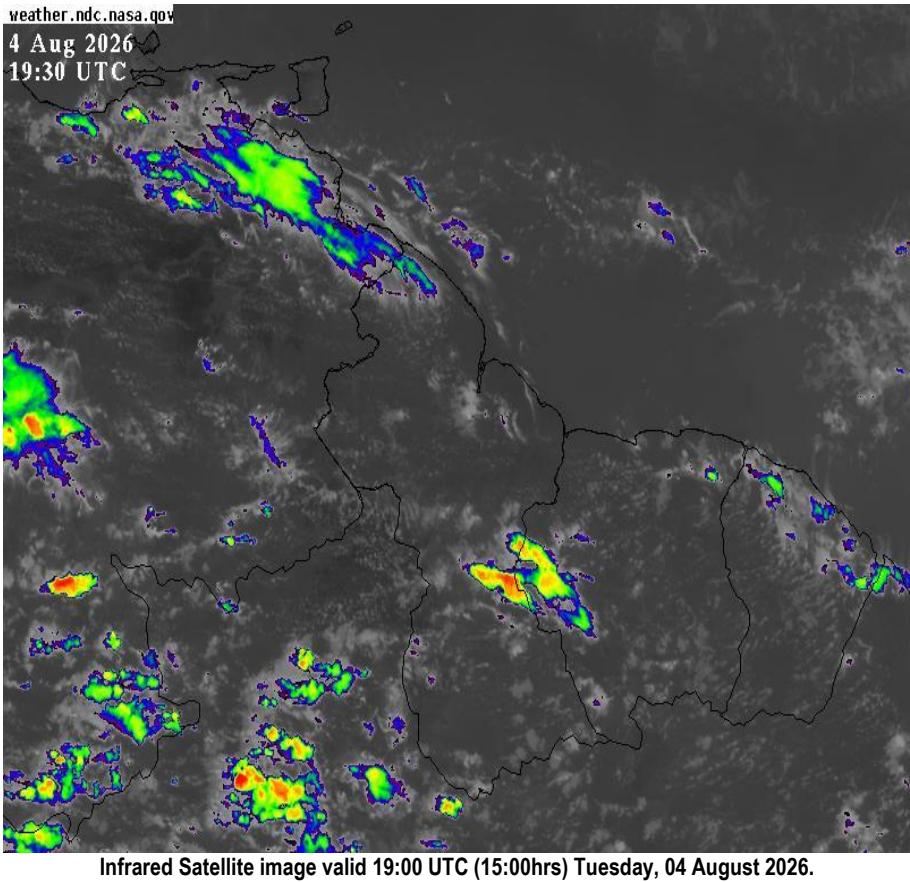

Spring Tide Advisory: The Spring Tide is in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 5 and 7 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Thursday and Saturday through Monday: Mostly fair and sunny skies, with interruptions of afternoon showers over inland and southern regions. **Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 15 mm over inland and southern regions; elsewhere, not significant within 24 hours.**

Friday: Partly cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers. **Rainfall is expected to be between 10 mm and 30 mm within 24 hours.**
