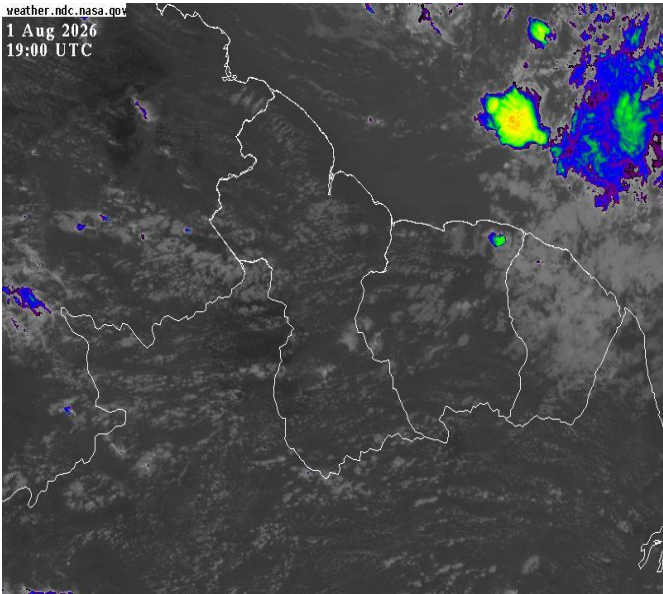
WEATHER BRIEF for Saturday 01 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Saturday, 01 August 2026, were available for some stations. Port Kaituma in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 10.0 mm
Synopsis: The dominance of the high-pressure ridge and the Saharan Air layer (SAL), are the main synoptic feature over Guyana. hence, mostly stable atmosphere.

Weather review: Except for scattered showers over hilly and sandy districts, mostly sunny skies dominated.

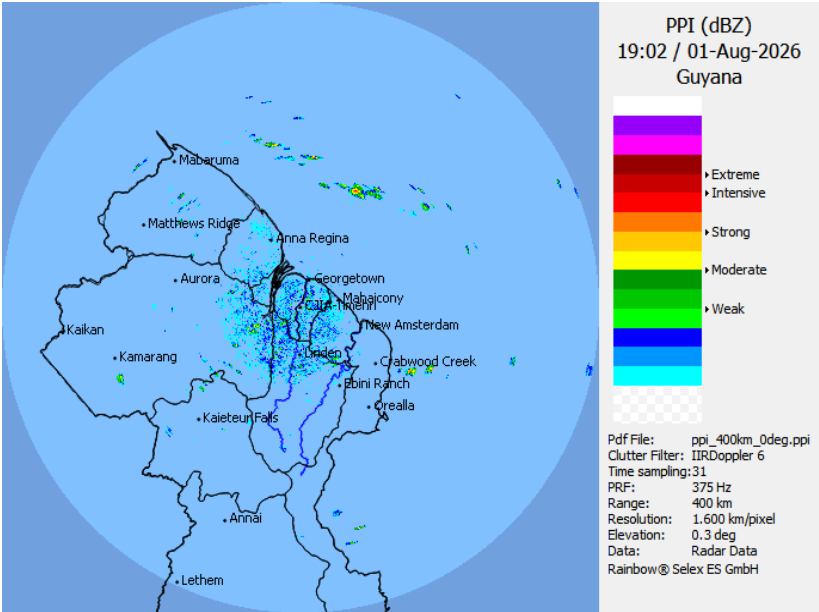
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 01 August to 10 August 2026, is 6.3mm per day.

Wednesday through Friday: Early morning showers over Region 8 and North Region 9. Elsewhere, mostly fair skies. For the remainder of the forecast period, no significant rainfall. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**
