WEATHER BRIEF for Friday 07 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Friday, 07 August 2026, were available for some stations. Mahdia in Region 8 recorded the highest rainfall of 28.0mm

Synopsis: A Tropical Wave (Tw) to the northeast of Guyana, interacting with the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), and the presence of the Saharan Air Layer, which is active over Guyana, is drying up some of the moisture being generated. Hence, moderate instability over Northern Guyana. In the other areas, weak instability.

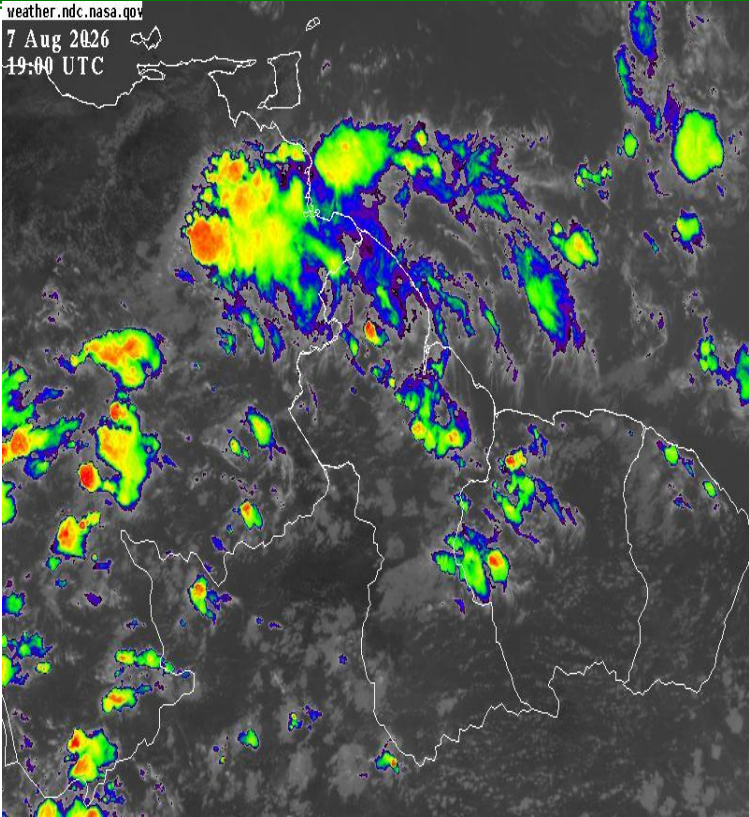
Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms over Regions 7, 8, 10 and inland areas of Regions 1 and 2. Elsewhere, mostly sunny skies.

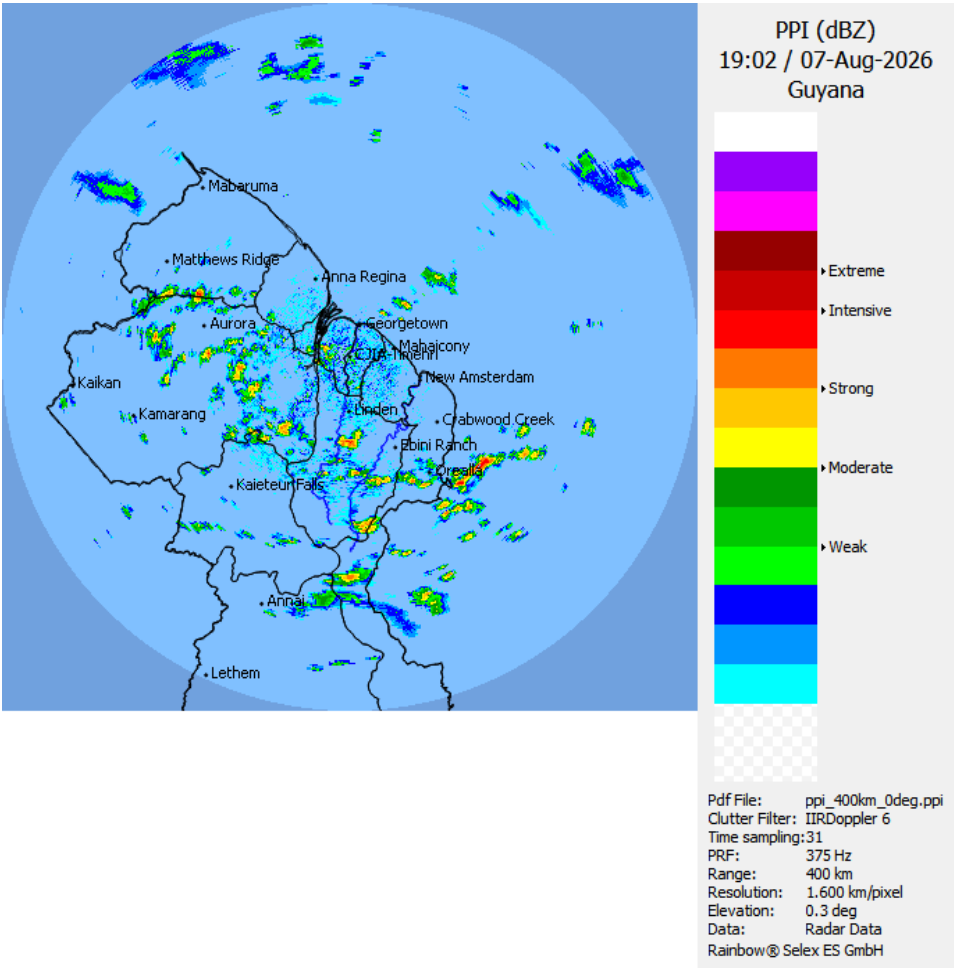

SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate in open waters with North-easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6ft) and increasing.

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Sunday through Thursday: Mostly fair and sunny skies will be interrupted by periods of cloudiness with brief passing showers over coastal areas in the morning, and inland areas in the remainder of the forecast period. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**
