WEATHER BRIEF for Sunday 09 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Sunday, 09 August 2026, were available for some stations. Wauna White Water Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 32.8mm

Synopsis: Saharan Air Layer (SAL), ridging, and local convection are the dominant features over Guyana. The atmosphere is expected to be mostly stable.

Weather review: Except for scattered showers, sunny skies dominated over all Regions.

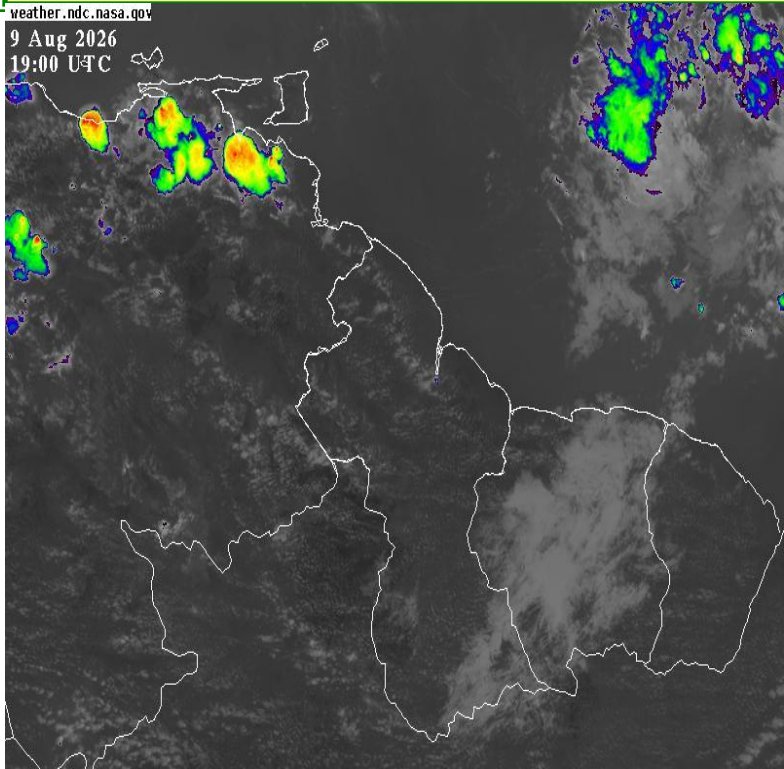

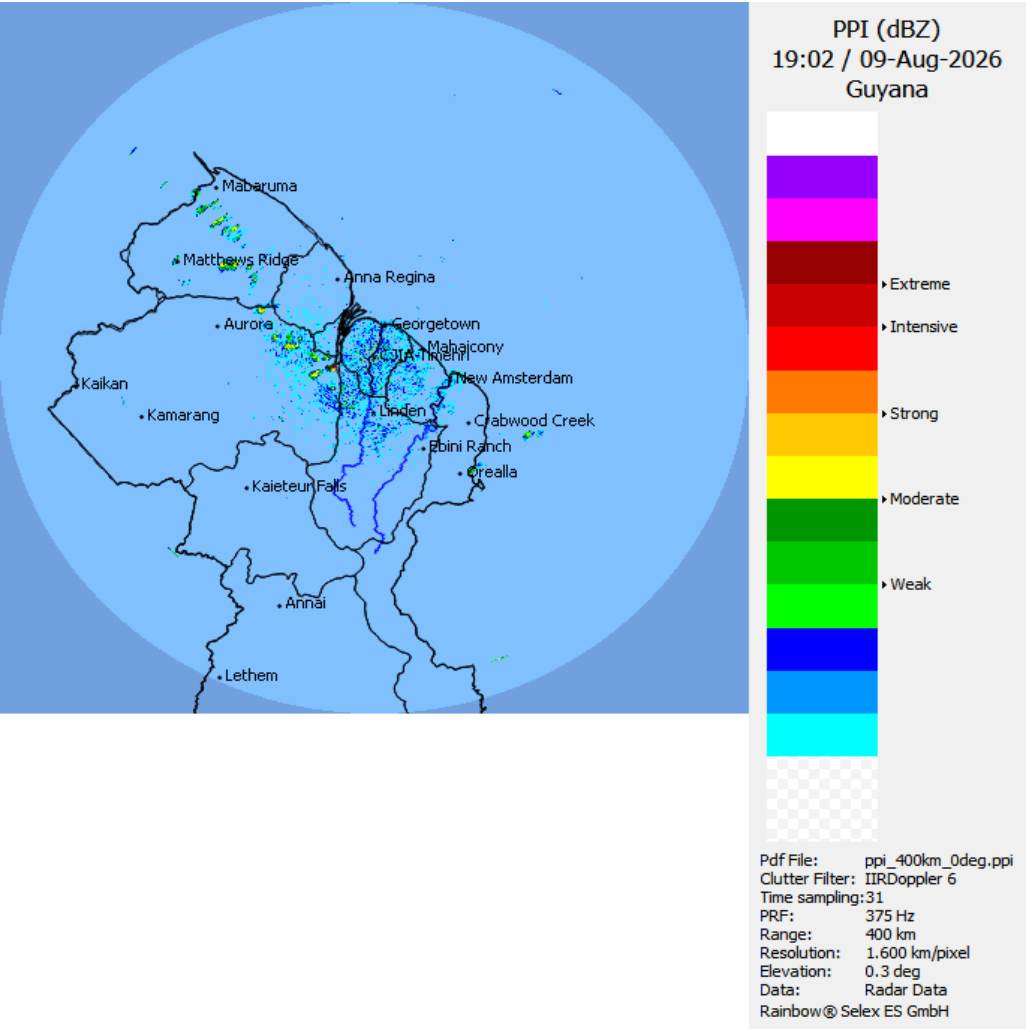
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 09 August to 18 August 2026, is 6.3mm per day.

Tuesday and Wednesday: Except for scattered showers over coastal areas in the morning, mostly fair and sunny skies. will prevail. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Thursday through Saturday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers in the morning over coastal areas, and other areas for the remainder of the forecast period. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**
