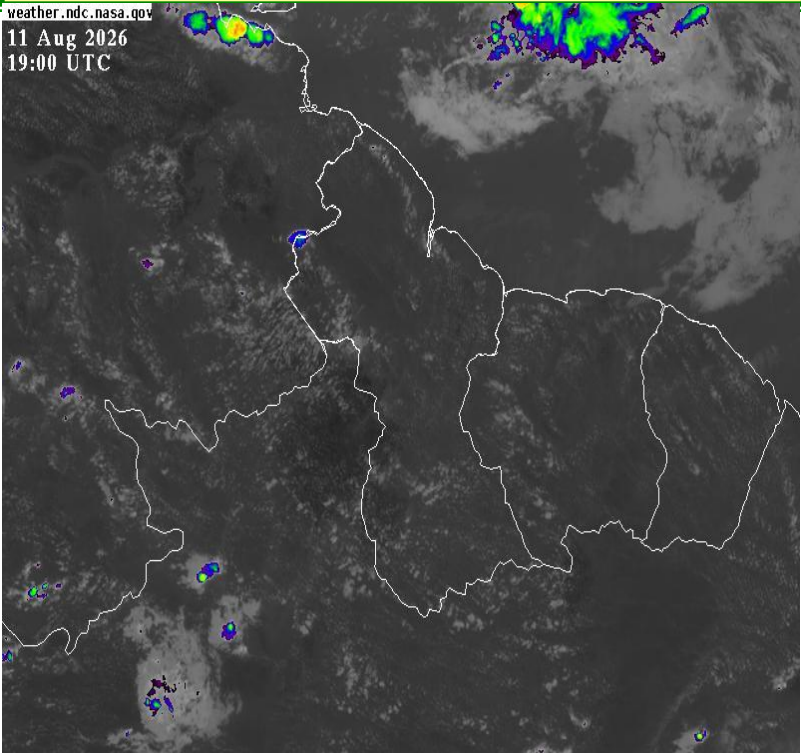
WEATHER BRIEF for Tuesday 11 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Tuesday, 11 August 2026, were available for some stations. Capoey Lake in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 3.4mm
Synopsis: Mostly stable atmosphere over Guyana. The Saharan Air Layer(SAL) and sinking motion are the dominant features.
Weather review: Except for brief passing showers over inland areas, sunny skies dominated.

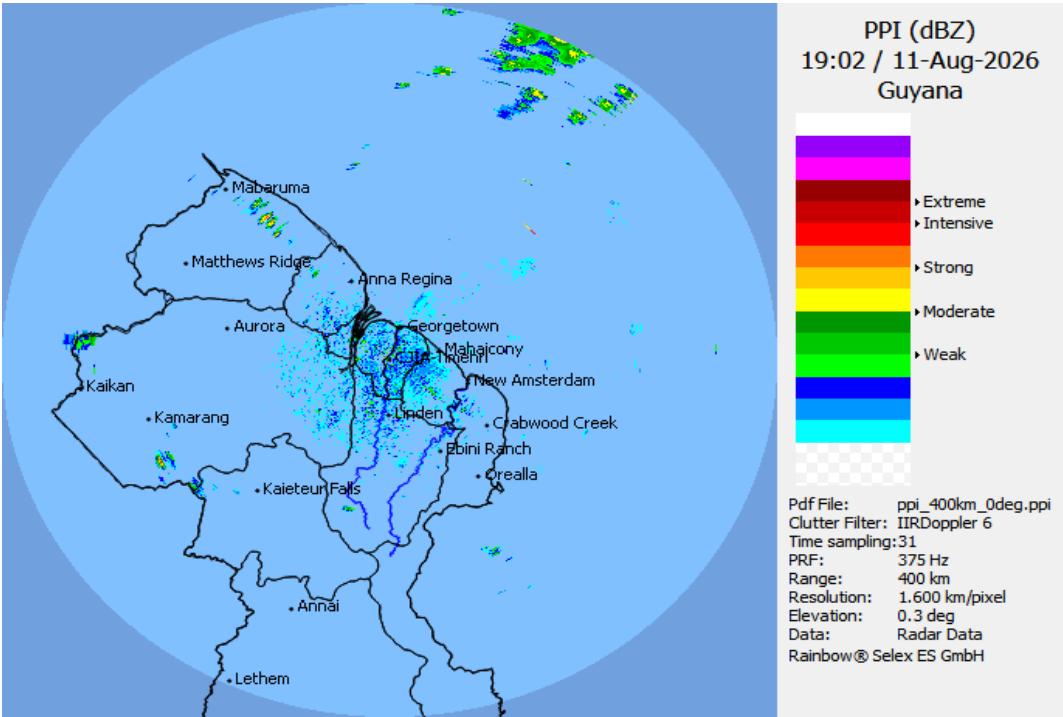

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers over Regions 1 to 3, 7, and 10. In the other areas, mostly fair and sunny skies. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Friday through Monday: Mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by periods of cloudiness, with brief showers over coastal areas in the morning and other areas for the remainder of the forecast period. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**
