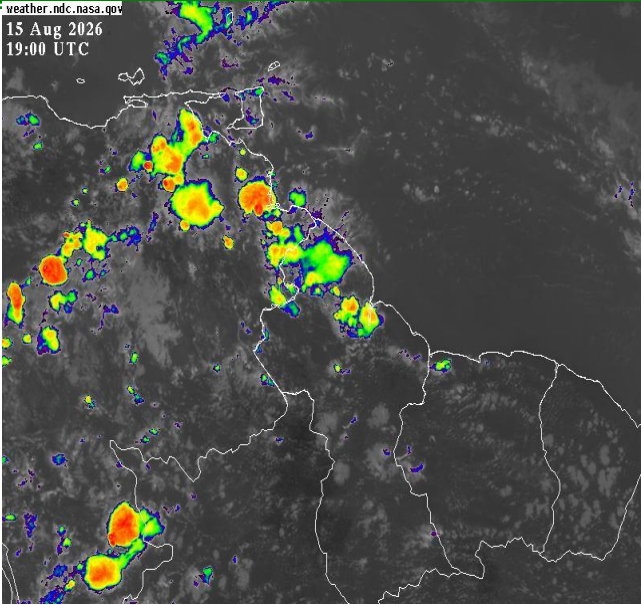
WEATHER BRIEF for Saturday 15 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Saturday, 15 August 2026, were available for some stations. Kumu in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 50.7mm
Synopsis: Remnants of Tropical Wave that exited Guyana generated some instability over Regions 1, 2, 7, and inland areas of Region 3 today. In the next 18 to 24 hours, another Tropical wave is approaching, moving North-westerly, and is interacting with the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ). Deep convection is being suppressed by dry air at the Mid-level.
Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers over Regions 1, 2, 7 and North Region 6. In the other areas, scattered showers

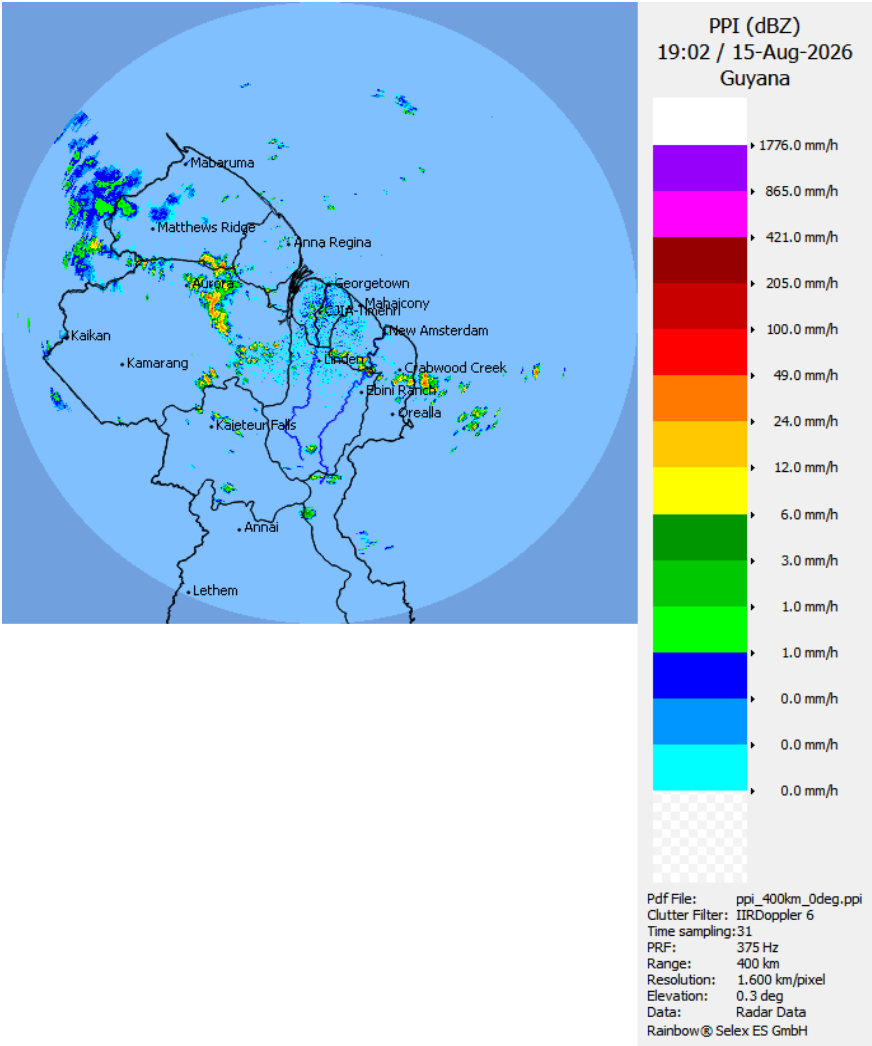

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Monday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers to occasional showers over Regions 1 to 3 and 7. In the other Regions, mostly sunny. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Tuesday: Mostly fair and sunny, with periods of cloudiness and scattered showers in the afternoon over inland areas. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Wednesday: Fair skies in the early morning. In the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, except for brief passing showers, mostly sunny skies. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Thursday and Friday: Mostly fair and sunny skies will be interrupted by some cloudiness with scattered showers over Regions 1 to 5, 7, 10, and North Region 6 in the afternoon. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**
