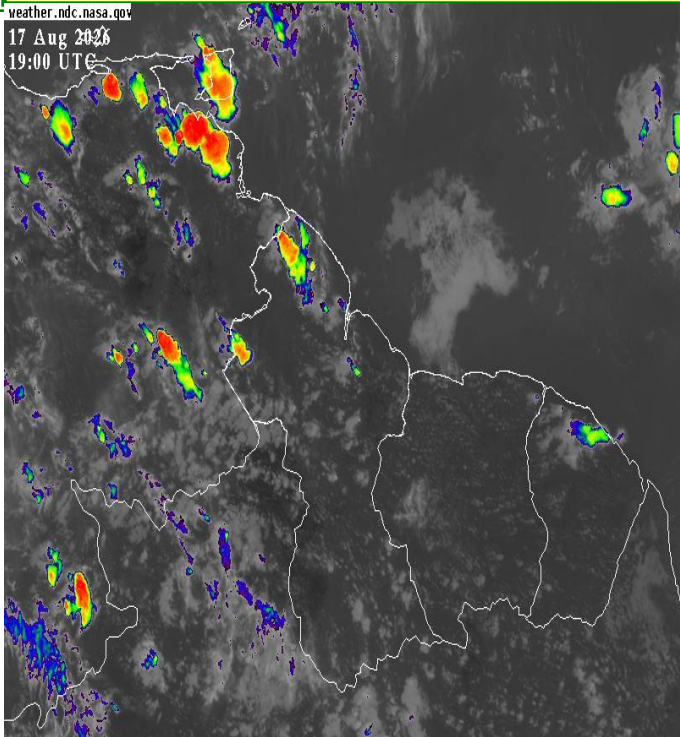
WEATHER BRIEF for Monday 17 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Monday, 17 August 2026, were available for some stations. Hossororo in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 14.8mm
Synopsis: Persistent dry southeasterly flow will continue across Guyana throughout the week as the ITCZ remains to the north. On Wednesday, a tropical wave passing north of Guyana is expected to induce some troughing, temporarily disrupting the otherwise stable pattern. After the wave passes, the drier southeasterly pattern is expected to re-establish itself.
Weather review: Except for some scattered showers over Regions 1 and 2, mostly sunny skies.

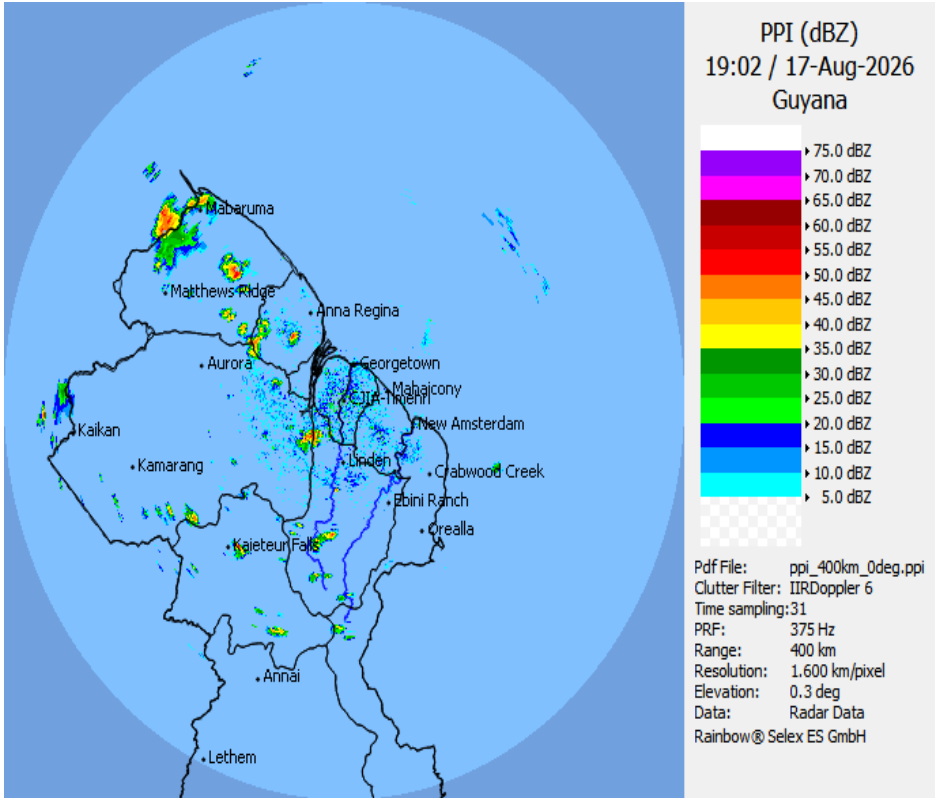

SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate in open waters with easterly to south-easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6ft) and increasing.

These waves will likely have periods of 6 and 7 seconds,

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Wednesday: Fair skies may be interrupted by some showers over coastal areas in the morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, except for brief showers over inland areas, mostly sunny skies. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Thursday: No significant rainfall in the early morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers in all Regions, except Region 9, Central and South Region 6. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**

Friday through Sunday: Partly cloudy to cloudy with brief showers over coastal areas in the morning and other areas for the remainder of the forecast period. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**
