Weather Brief for Wednesday, 19 August 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

John Village in Region 6 recorded the highest rainfall of 6.1mm

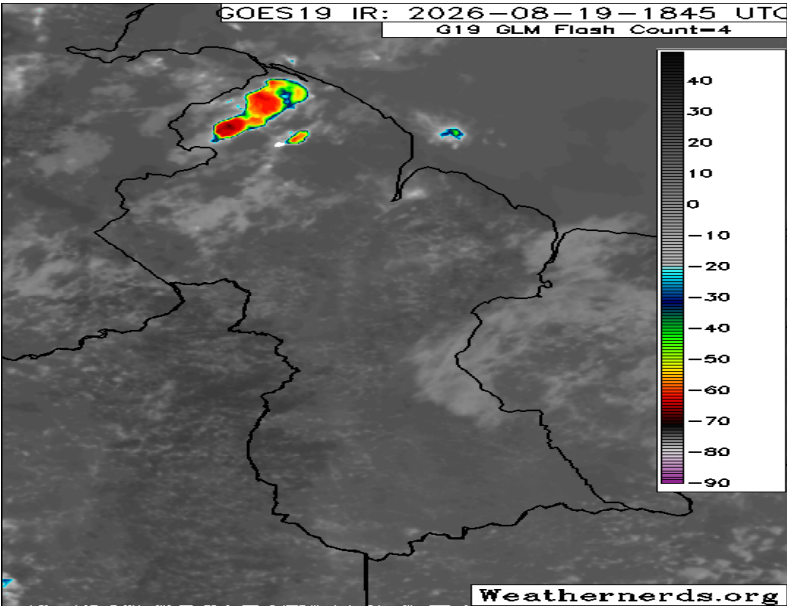
Synopsis: Weak instabilities scattered along the axis of the ITCZ, which remains positioned north of Guyana, continue to influence the local weather pattern. Model guidance indicates that similar conditions are expected to persist through Friday. Thereafter, a drier southeasterly flow is forecast to re-establish itself across Guyana, resulting in generally more stable conditions and reduced rainfall activity.

Today's weather review: A mix of sunshine and clouds with scattered showers was observed across Guyana.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days, August 20, 2026 to August 29, 2026, is 4.0mm per day.

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Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be slight to moderate with easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters (3 to 5 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Thursday and Friday: mostly cloudy skies can be expected throughout Guyana with scattered to occasional light to moderate showers. Isolated thunderstorms are likely between the late morning and mid-afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 10 and 30 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.**

Saturday to Monday, sunny skies can be expected. No significant rainfall is likely.

Tuesday, cloudy skies with occasional showers over coastal areas from mid-morning into the afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 40 mm.**
