WEATHER BRIEF for Thursday 20 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Thursday, 20 August 2026, were available for some stations. Soesdyke Forestry in Region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 23.8mm

Synopsis: No significant Synoptic feature. However, local convection is responsible for an unstable atmosphere over Regions 7,10, Central Region 6, and inland areas of Regions 1 to 3 today. The Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) is to the North of Guyana, and an approaching Tropical wave is not expected to generate any significant convection. Hence, the atmosphere over Guyana is expected to be mostly stable throughout the weekend.

Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers and thundershowers over Regions 7, 10, Central Region 6 and inland areas of Regions 1 to 3. Elsewhere, mostly sunny skies.

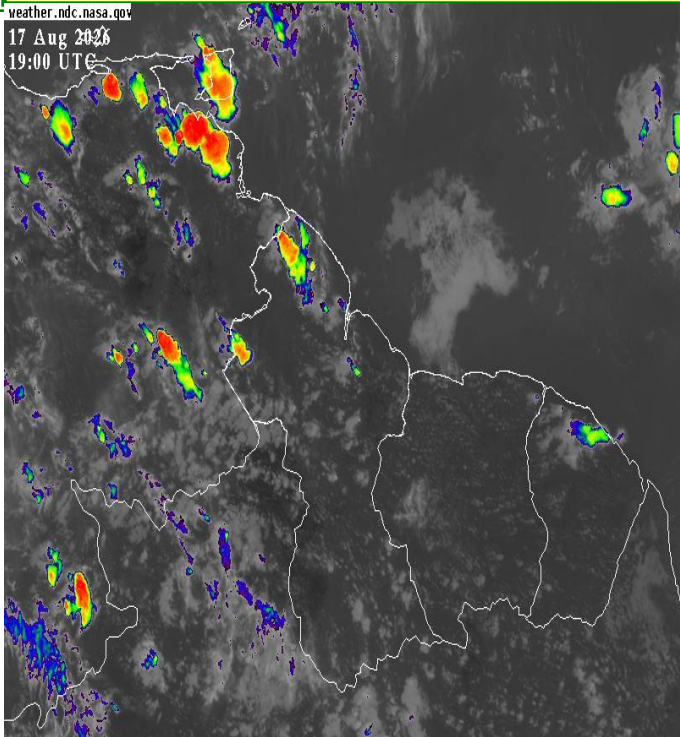

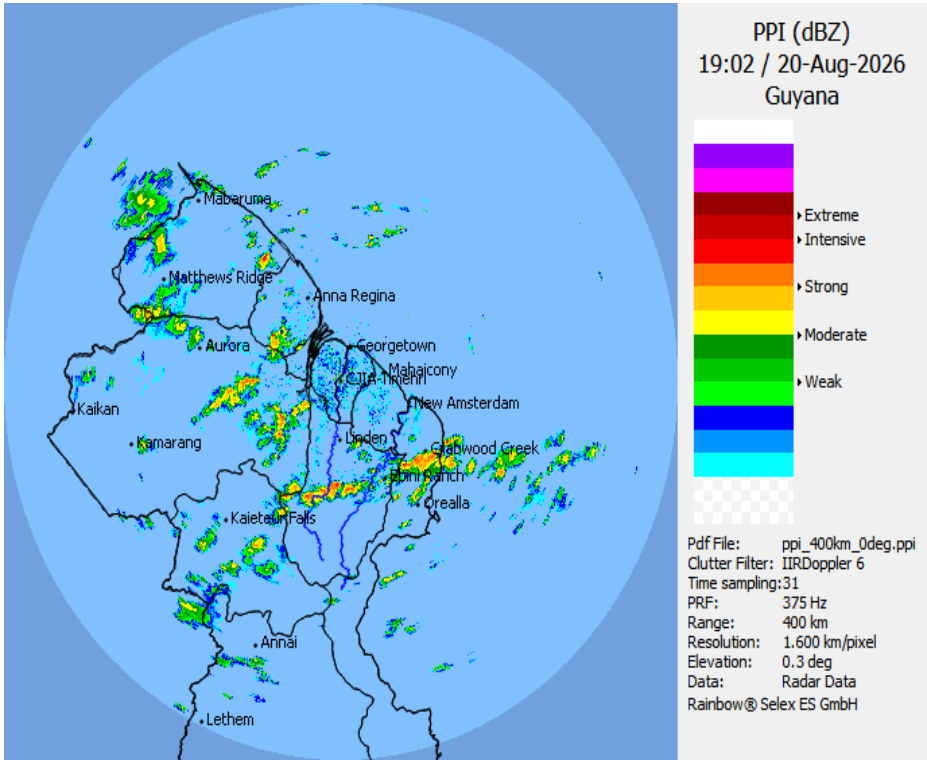
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 20 August to 29 August 2026, is 4.0mm per day.

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Saturday and Sunday: No significant rainfall in the early morning; in the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5 and 15mm.**

Monday through Wednesday: Mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by periods of cloudiness with scattered showers. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5 and 15mm.**
