Weather Brief for Friday, 21 August 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Ebini in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 32.9 mm

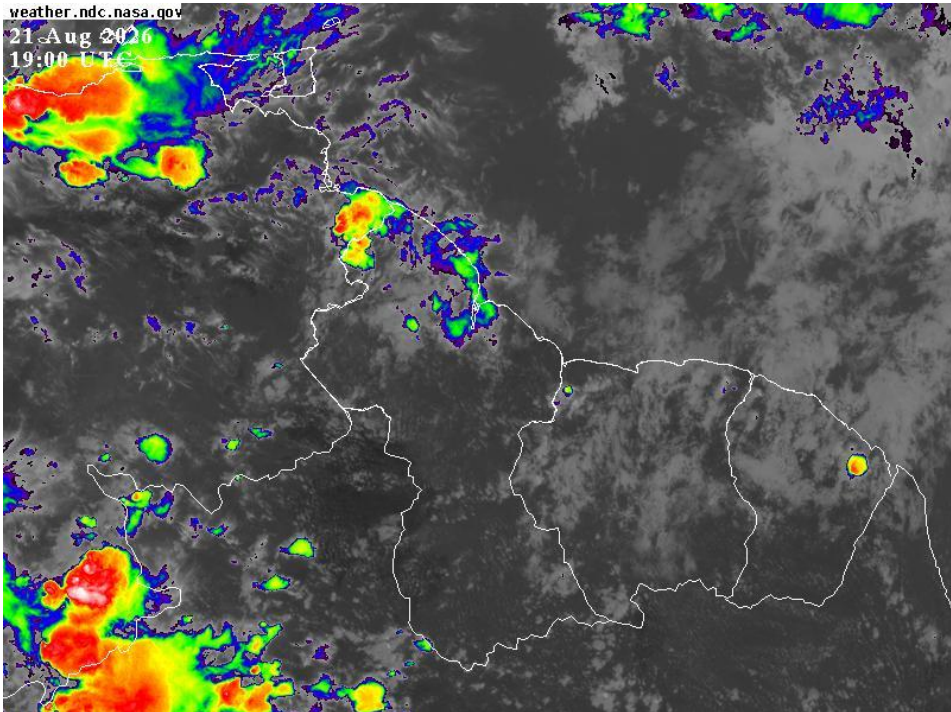
Synopsis: Low-level moisture plumes will continue to move across Guyana through tomorrow, maintaining mild atmospheric instability and the potential for isolated to scattered showers. Thereafter, drier and more stable conditions are expected to become established, resulting in generally fairer weather.

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms over coastal areas.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days, August 22, 2026 to August 31, 2026, is 3.2mm per day.

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Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be smooth to gentle with easterly waves reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters (2 to 4 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 5 and 7 seconds.
- Gentle easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Sunday, Monday and Thursday: Sunny skies across Guyana with localised showers. **No significant rainfall is likely.**

Tuesday and Wednesday: Cloudy skies with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms during the early afternoon. **Rainfall expected between 10 and 20 mm.**
