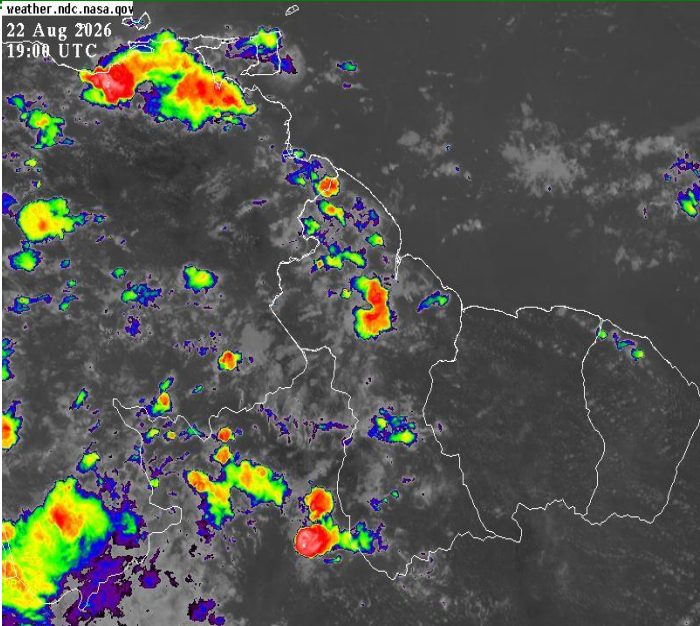
WEATHER BRIEF for Saturday 22 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Saturday, 22 August 2026, were available for some stations. De Kendren Back in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 86.3mm
Synopsis: No significant Synoptic feature. However, local convection is responsible for an unstable atmosphere over Regions 7,10, and inland areas of Regions 1 to 3 today. The Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) is to the North of Guyana, and an approaching Tropical wave is not expected to generate any significant convection. Hence, the atmosphere over Guyana is expected to be mostly stable for the remainder of the week and into the new week.
Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers and thundershowers over Regions 7, 10 and inland areas of Regions 1 to 3. Elsewhere, except for brief passing showers, sunny skies.

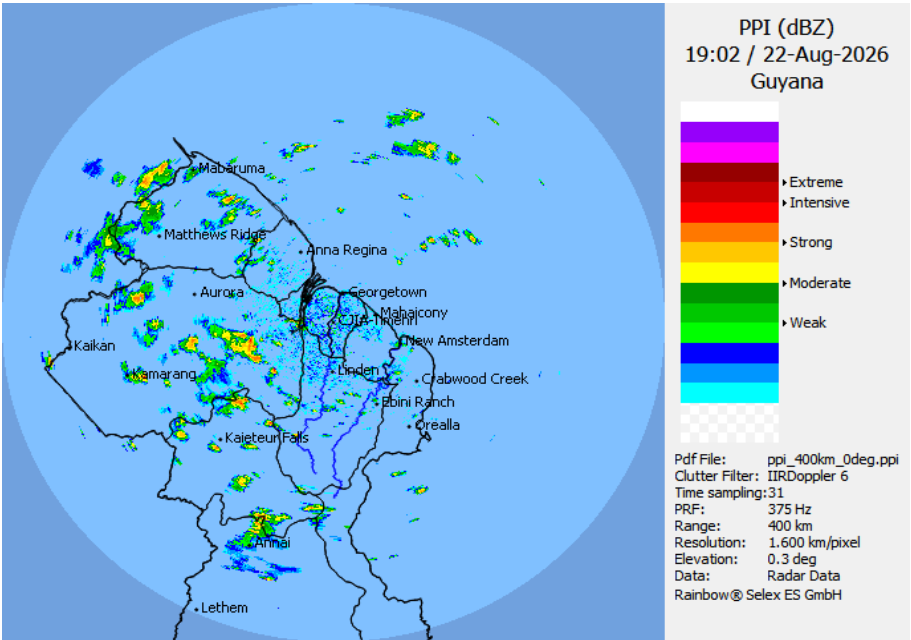

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SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate in open waters with easterly to south-easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6ft) and increasing.

These waves will likely have periods of 6 and 7 seconds,

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Tonight: Scattered to occasional showers over the Central Region 9 and coastal areas. Elsewhere, fair skies.

Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.

Sunday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers over Regions 7,10 and inland areas of Regions 1 to 5. In the other areas, partly cloudy and sunny. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Monday: No significant rainfall in the early morning. For the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, except for scattered showers over inland areas, mostly sunny skies. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Tuesday and Wednesday: No significant rainfall in the early morning. In the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, Regions 1 to 3 can expect scattered to occasional showers. In the other Regions, mostly sunny skies. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**

Thursday and Friday: Except for scattered showers, mostly fair and sunny skies. **Rainfall is not significant.**
