Weather Brief for Sunday, 23 August 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs available for most of the stations.

Annai in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 12.6 mm

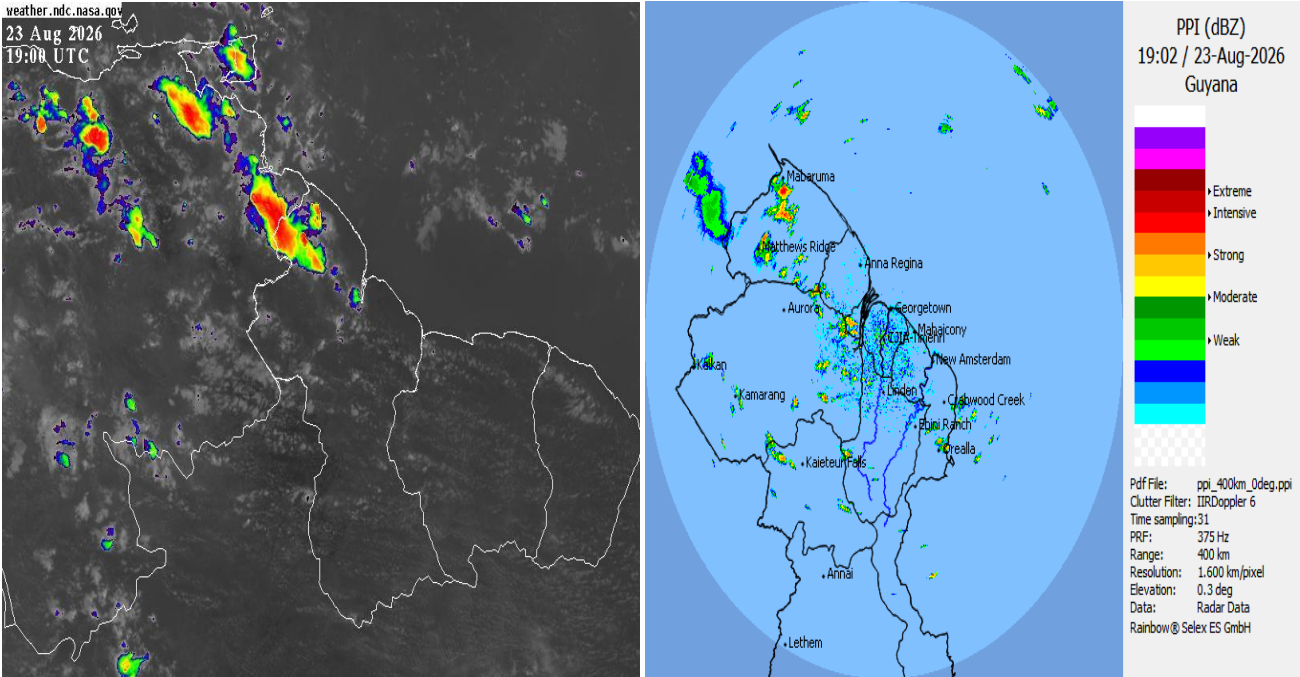
Synopsis: The high-pressure ridge remains the dominant synoptic feature over Guyana, supporting generally stable and relatively dry conditions. Tuesday and Wednesday, the ridge is expected to weaken somewhat as induced troughing develops, while mild ITCZ activity increases low-level moisture and atmospheric instability. This combination should result in a greater potential for scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms. Thereafter, drier and more stable conditions are expected to re-establish, as the influence of the ridge strengthens. Consequently, shower and thunderstorm activity should become more isolated.

Today's weather review: Scattered showers and thunderstorms were observed over Region 1. All other areas saw sunny skies with a few cloudy periods.

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Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be smooth to gentle with northeasterly waves reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters (2 to 4 feet) and steady.

- These waves will likely have periods of between 5 and 6 seconds.

- Gentle to moderate east to southeasterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday and Wednesday: Mostly cloudy skies throughout Guyana with intermittent to frequent showers. Thunderstorms likely over coastal areas. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 50 mm.

Thursday to Saturday: Sunshine and clouds with isolated afternoon thunderstorms and localised showers. No significant rainfall is likely.
