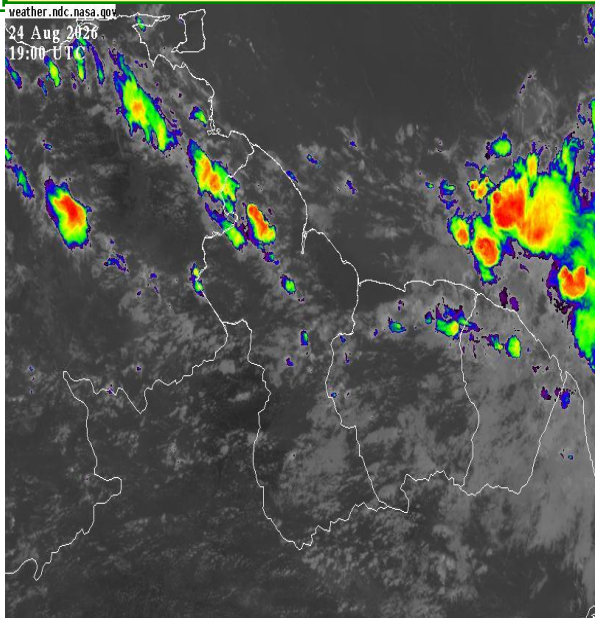
WEATHER BRIEF for Monday 24 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Monday, 24 August 2026, were available for some stations. Wauna White Water in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 23.3mm
Synopsis: Mild to moderate instability is being driven by the high-pressure ridge and local convection. Daytime convection is generating local instability, but is being suppressed by atmospheric sinking motion. Hence, rainfall is restricted. The current feature is expected to continue throughout the week.
Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers and isolated thundershowers over inland areas. Elsewhere, sunshine dominated.

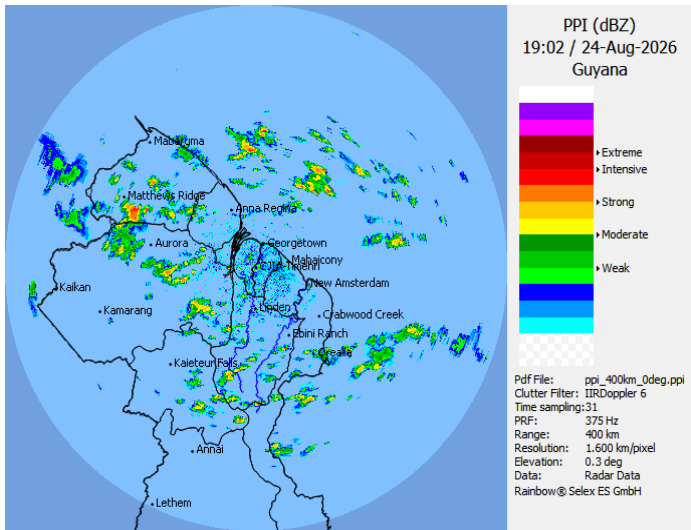

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: Becomes effective from Wednesday 26 August, 2026.

Our Mission: To Observe, archive and understand Guyana’s weather, and Climate and provide meteorological, hydrological and oceanographic service in support of Guyana’s national needs and international obligation.

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SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate in open waters with easterly to south-easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6ft) and increasing.

These waves will likely have periods of 7 and 8 seconds,

Winds: Light to Gentle North-easterly to easterly breeze.

Wednesday: No significant rainfall in the early morning. In the late morning and early afternoon, all Regions can expect scattered to occasional showers. The remainder of the forecast period has no significant rainfall. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5 and 20mm.**

Thursday through Sunday: Fair and sunny skies may be interrupted by periods of cloudiness with brief passing showers in all Regions. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**
