WEATHER BRIEF for Monday 08 December 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Monday, 08 December 2025, were available for some stations. Capoey Lake in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 101.9mm.

<u>Synopsis</u>: Moisture intrusion from the Intertropical Convergence Zone(ITCZ) continued to generate weak to moderate instability. The feature is expected to continue for the remainder of the Week.

<u>Weather review</u>: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers and thundershowers in Regions 1 to 4 and 7. In the other Regions, scattered showers.




Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 08 December to 17 December 2025, is 9.1mm per day.

<u>SEA CONDITIONS</u>: Rough seas will likely produce hazardous sea conditions, coupled with spring tides can lead to over-topping and damage of river and sea defences, along low-lying and riverine areas. Pearsons are advised to exercise caution to protect their lives and property. These waves will likely have periods of between 6 and 9 seconds.

Winds: Moderate North-easterly to Easterly breeze.

<u>Tuesday</u>: Mostly cloudy with frequent showers in Regions 1 to 4 and 7. In the other Regions, partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. Rainfall between 0 and 30mm.

<u>Wednesday and Thursday</u>: Cloudy with early morning showers in coastal areas. Elsewhere, partly cloudy with no significant rainfall. Otherwise, partly cloudy to cloudy skies, with no significant rainfall. For the remainder of the forecast period. partly cloudy to cloudy skies with frequent showers in Regions 1 to 3 and 7. Otherwise, scattered showers. Rainfall between 0 and 30mm.

<u>Friday</u>: Cloudy skies with frequent showers in Regions 7, 10, and the coastal areas of Regions 2 to 4. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall in the morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, Partly cloudy to cloudy with scattered showers. Rainfall between 15 and 25mm, in Regions 7, 10, and the coastal areas of Regions 2 to 4. Elsewhere, 0 and 15.

<u>Saturday and Sunday</u>: Cloudy to overcast with frequent showers and thundershowers in Regions 1 to 3. Elsewhere, scattered showers in the morning. In the afternoon and the remainder of the forecast period, partly cloudy and sunny skies are expected with no significant rainfall.
