WEATHER BRIEF for Wednesday 04 February 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Wednesday, 04 February 2026, were available for some stations. Leguan in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 12.1mm.

Synopsis: Weak to moderate low-level convection is dominant, in the mid and high levels, with sinking motion; the atmosphere in the forecast area is stable, and will continue for the remainder of the week.

Weather review: Partly cloudy and sunny skies with no significant rainfall.




Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 04 to 13 February 2026, is 4.1m per day.

SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate to rough in open waters with North-easterly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 meters (6 to 9 ft) and increasing.

- These waves will likely have periods of 8 and 14 seconds

Winds: Gentle to moderate North-easterly to Easterly breeze.

Friday through Sunday: Mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by periods of cloudiness with scattered showers along coastal areas in the morning, and elsewhere, in the remainder of the forecast period.

Rainfall between 0 and 10mm

Monday and Tuesday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers in Regions 2 to 4, 7, and 10. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall. **Rainfall between 0 and 20mm**
