Weather Brief for Sunday, 01 February 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Sunday, 01 February 2026 were available for most of the stations.

Karaudamaua in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 9.5 mm.


Synopsis: The high-pressure ridge remains the dominant weather feature affecting Guyana and is expected to persist for the remainder of the week, maintaining generally stable conditions.

Today's weather review: Sunny skies were observed across Guyana.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be moderate, with easterly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 metres (6 to 9 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods are forecast to range between 7 and 8 seconds.

- Moderate easterly breeze expected.
