**Marine Advisory:** High surface winds coupled with long-period, high-energy waves present a risk to river and sea defences in vulnerable locations. Residents in low-lying and riverine areas are urged to remain vigilant and prepared to respond to changing conditions.

**Weather Brief for Tuesday, 10 February 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.**

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 10 February 2026 were available for most of the stations.

**Lesbeholden in Region 06 recorded the highest rainfall of 14.3 mm.**


**Synopsis:** No significant changes were observed during the past 24 hours. A high-pressure ridge continues to dominate the synoptic pattern across Guyana, while the presence of elevated Saharan dust within the low- to mid-troposphere has maintained a generally stable atmospheric environment.

**Today's weather review:** Cloudy skies with scattered showers over regions 2, 6, 7, and 10. Sunny skies elsewhere.

Sea conditions:

**Open waters are expected to be moderate to rough with northwest to northerly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 metres (7 to 10 feet) and steady.**

- Wave periods are forecast to range between 13 and 14 seconds.
- Moderate northeast to easterly breeze expected.

**Extended Forecast**

Thursday: Cloudy to overcast skies with frequent showers and rain. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 50 mm.**

Friday: Fair and sunny skies can be expected across Guyana. **No significant rainfall is likely.**

Saturday to Monday, partly cloudy to cloudy skies can be expected across Guyana with scattered showers. **Rainfall is expected to be between 5 and 15 mm within 24 hours accumulation.**
