**Weather Brief for Saturday, 14 February 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.**

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Saturday, 14 February 2026 were available for most of the stations.

**Dagg Point in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 14.9 mm.**


**Synopsis:** The Atlantic ridge will remain modest but sufficient to maintain steady trades, contributing to shallow cloud patches moving inland from the coast during the overnight and early morning hours. Low-level flows will remain generally easterly to east-northeasterly, with limited moisture convergence inland. Monitoring will continue for any perturbations embedded within the easterly flow that could temporarily enhance moisture and instability.

**Today's weather review:** Mostly fair to occasionally cloudy skies were observed across Guyana with a few isolated showers.

**Sea conditions:**

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 metres (4 to 6 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 7 and 8 seconds.

- Gentle to moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

**Extended Forecast**

**Monday to Friday:** Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with brief to scattered showers. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 0 and 15 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.**
