**Weather Brief for Monday, 16 February 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.**

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Monday, 16 February 2026 were available for most of the stations.

**Wowetta in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 26.3 mm.**


**Synopsis:** The Atlantic ridge will remain modest but sufficient to maintain steady trades, contributing to shallow cloud patches moving inland from the coast during the overnight and early morning hours. Monitoring will continue for any perturbations embedded within the easterly flow that could temporarily enhance moisture and instability.

**Today's weather review:** Apart from a few isolated showers, mainly sunny skies were observed.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be moderate with northeast to easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 metres (4 to 7 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 7 and 8 seconds.

- Gentle to moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday and Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional light showers. Rainfall is expected between 5 and 20 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.

Friday and Saturday: Mostly cloudy to overcast skies with frequent light to moderate showers. Rainfall is expected between 20 and 40 mm over southern Guyana and elsewhere, between 0 and 25 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.

Sunday: Mostly fair to sunny skies with a few isolated showers. No significant rainfall is likely.
