**Marine Advisory:** Long-period, high-energy waves present a risk to river and sea defences in vulnerable locations. Residents in low-lying and riverine areas are urged to remain vigilant and prepared to respond to changing conditions.

**Weather Brief for Monday, 09 February 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.**

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Monday, 09 February 2026 were available for most of the stations.

**Track. F. Bydarabu in Region 07 recorded the highest rainfall of 25.0 mm.**


**Synopsis:** A persistent high-pressure ridge continues to dominate the synoptic pattern over Guyana. From tomorrow, an increase in low- to mid-level moisture is expected, associated with an induced troughing feature. However, the presence of elevated Saharan dust layers within the low- to mid-troposphere is likely to suppress deep convective development, limiting widespread and significant activity.

**Today's weather review:** Sunny skies were observed across Guyana with a few isolated showers over regions 6 and 10.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be moderate with northerly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 metres (6 to 8 feet) and increasing.

- Wave periods are forecast to range between 14 and 15 seconds.
- Moderate northeast to easterly breeze expected.

**Extended Forecast**

Wednesday and Thursday: Mostly cloudy skies with occasional to frequent showers. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 40 mm.

Friday to Sunday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 and 15 mm.
