WEATHER BRIEF for today Tuesday, 07 April 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Tuesday, April 7, 2026, were available for most stations.

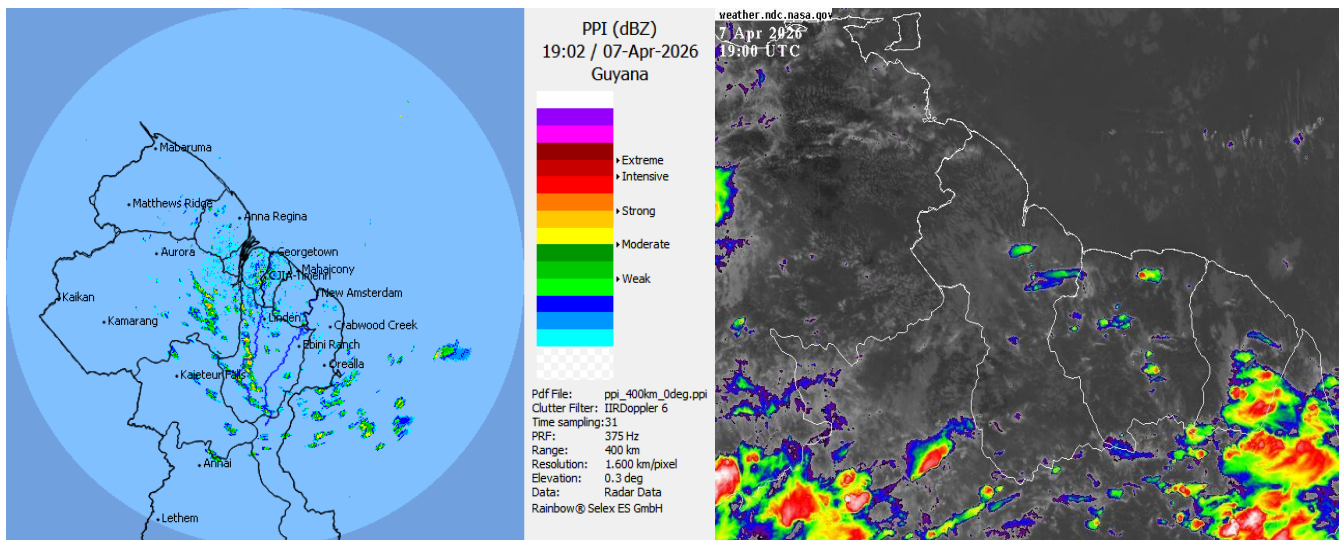
Kwakwani in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 12.0 mm.

Synopsis: As the forecast area continues to shift to more stable conditions, the ridge of high pressure is the dominant synoptic feature. However, mild to moderate instabilities were experienced over areas in Regions 6 and 10. These instabilities are expected to move further Inland during the evening. Meteorological models are still indicating that mostly stable conditions are expected to continue over Coastal Guyana, with mild to moderate instabilities due to localized conditions likely over Inland and Southern Guyana.

Today's weather review: Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers over Inland areas. Fair and sunny skies elsewhere.

Extended Forecast

Thursday: Cloudy skies with isolated showers, ranging from light to moderate, can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 5 during the early morning. Improvements are expected from mid-morning as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. Regions 1, 6 to 10, and Inland areas along Regions 1 to 4, cloudy skies with scattered showers and rain. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 30.0 mm within 24 hours.**

Friday through Monday: Partly cloudy to sunny and hazy skies are likely to be experienced over Coastal Regions 1 to 5, with no significant rainfall expected. All remaining areas can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 15.0 mm within 24 hours.**
