WEATHER BRIEF for today Monday, 03 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Monday, August 3, 2026, were available for most stations.

Abary MMA in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 46.5 mm.

Marine Advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding, as over-topping is likely.

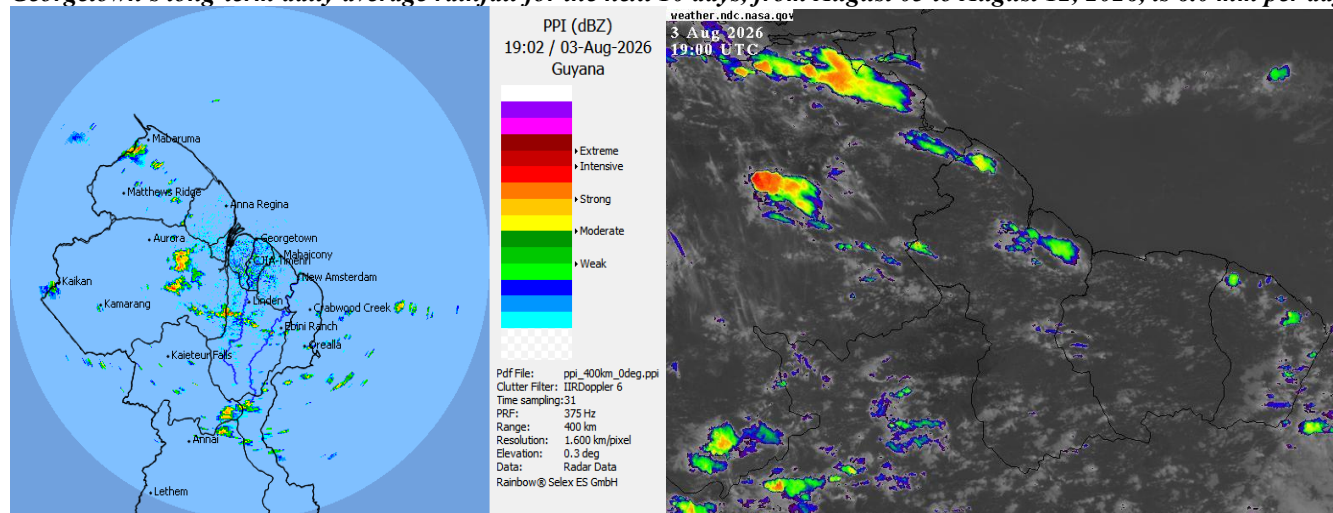
***Severe Weather Warnings.* In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.**

Synopsis: Mostly stable conditions were observed over most of Guyana. Ridging at the low levels coupled with dry mid to upper levels due to the Saharan Dust are the dominant features of interest. However, localized diurnal heating did contribute to isolated pockets of instability over Inland Guyana. These instabilities are expected to continue into the evening hours and will also affect Regions 8 and 9. Elsewhere, mostly stable conditions are expected to persist. Stable conditions are generally expected to continue for most of the week. A weak tropical wave is expected on Friday and will likely increase instabilities over Regions 1 to 7 and 10.

Today's weather review: *Isolated showers and thundershowers were observed over Inland areas of Regions 1 and 7. Elsewhere, fair and sunny skies.*

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: SLIGHT TO MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTH-EASTERLY WAVES REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.0 TO 1.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 7 AND 8 SECONDS. GENTLE TO MODERATE EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday: Light isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the early morning, with partly cloudy and sunny skies likely to persist from mid-morning. Rainfall is not expected to be significant over these areas. Inland areas and parts of Southern Guyana can expect fair and sunny skies during the morning, with cloudy skies accompanied by isolated showers and thundershowers likely from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 5.0 mm to 20.0 mm within 24 hours over Inland areas and Southern Guyana.**

Friday: Cloudy skies accompanied by isolated to scattered showers and intermittent rain can be expected over Regions 1 to 7 and 10. Coastal Regions will likely see improvements in conditions during the afternoon as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. **Rainfall is expected to range from 5.0 mm to 35.0 mm.** Regions 8 and 9 can expect mostly sunny skies.
