WEATHER BRIEF for today Thursday, 06 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Thursday, August 6, 2026, were available for most stations.

Kamarang in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 24.3 mm.

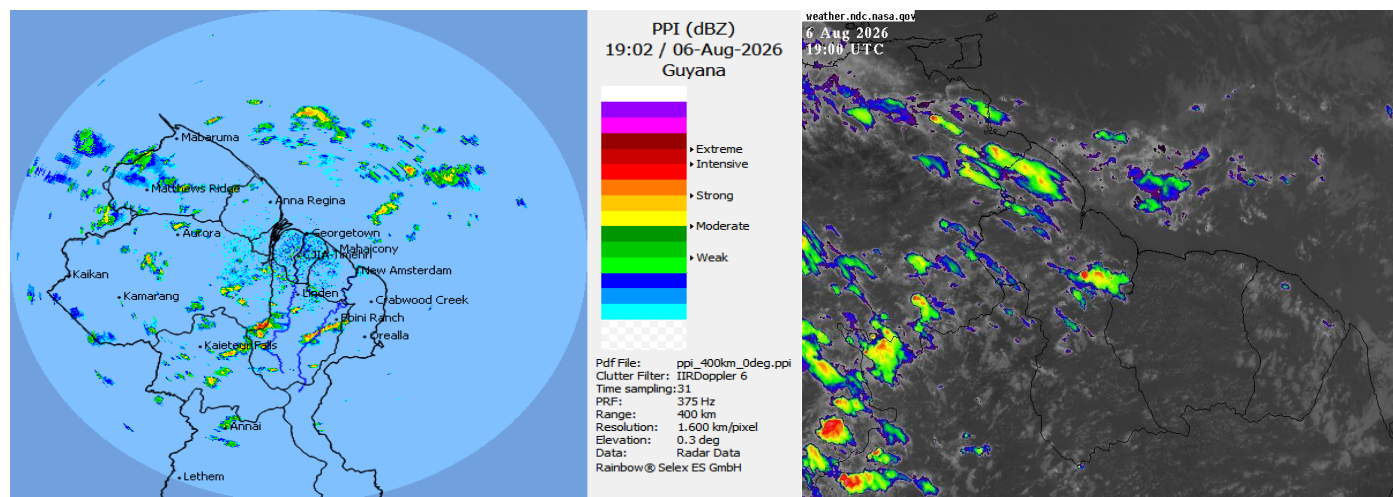
***Severe Weather Warnings.* In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.**

Synopsis: The ITCZ was analyzed over the North-eastern coast of Guyana and affected areas over Regions 1 and 2 as the day progressed. The position of the ITCZ is expected to remain slightly north of Region 1 and will continue to affect these areas. Inland and Southern Guyana also experience mild to moderate instabilities from the afternoon due to localized conditions and low-level troughs. These instabilities are expected to continue into the evening hours, after which ridging is expected to become dominant. The remainder of the country continues to experience dry and stable conditions. The Ridge and the Saharan Air Layer are the dominant features over these areas. As we move into the weekend, mostly dry and stable conditions are expected over Regions 3 to 5. The ITCZ and localized diurnal heating will continue to produce isolated pockets of instability over Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10.

Today's weather review: Isolated showers and thundershowers were observed over Regions 1, 2, Inland and Southern Guyana. Elsewhere, fair and sunny skies.

Extended Forecast

Saturday through Wednesday: Partly cloudy, sunny and hazy skies likely to persist over Regions 3 to 5, with no significant rainfall expected. Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10 can expect fair and sunny skies during the morning, with cloudy skies accompanied by isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers likely from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 5.0 mm to 25.0 mm within 24 hours over Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10.**
