WEATHER BRIEF for today Wednesday, 12 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Wednesday, August 12, 2026, were available for most stations.

Imbaimadai in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 18.0 mm.

***Severe Weather Warnings.* In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.**

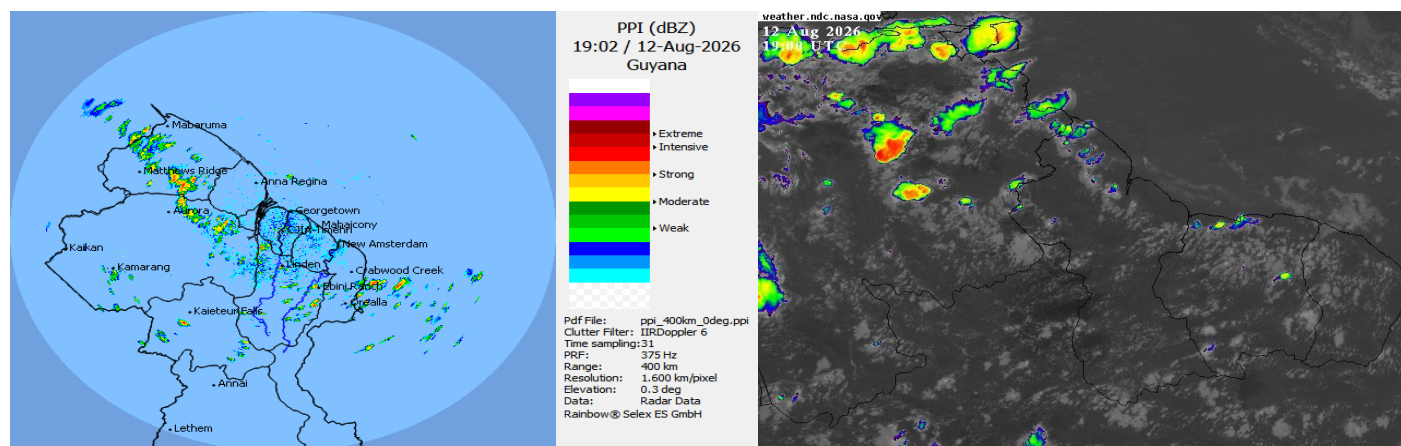
Marine Advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding, as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: Mostly stable conditions over Coastal and Southern Guyana. Isolated pockets of instability were observed over Inland areas along Regions 1 to 5 and 7. These instabilities are expected to continue until the early evening hours. Elsewhere, stable conditions are expected to continue into the night. Tomorrow, meteorological models are indicating that mostly dry and stable conditions are expected to continue over Coastal and Southern Guyana. Localized diurnal heating will continue to produce isolated convection over the aforementioned Inland areas. A tropical wave embedded within a low-pressure system is moving across the Atlantic, with the tail end of this system likely to affect Northern Guyana on Friday and likely continue into Saturday morning. This will likely increase the instability over these areas. From Sunday, mostly dry and stable conditions are expected.

Today's weather review: *Isolated showers and thundershowers were observed over Inland areas along Regions 1 to 5 and 7. Elsewhere, fair and sunny skies.*

Extended Forecast

Friday and Saturday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers, rain, and thundershowers can be expected over Regions 1 to 3 and 7. Regions 4 to 6 and 10 can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers during the morning, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 and 35.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over Regions 1 to 3 and 7. All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies.

Sunday through Tuesday: Partly cloudy, sunny, and hazy skies likely to persist over Coastal Regions 3 to 6, Regions 6 to 10, with no significant rainfall expected. Inland areas along Regions 1, 2, and 7 can expect fair and sunny skies during the morning, with cloudy skies accompanied by isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers likely from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 0.0 mm to 20.0 mm over Inland areas along Regions 1 to 5, 7, and 10, within 24 hours.**
