WEATHER BRIEF for today Friday, 14 August 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Friday, August 14, 2026, were available for most stations.

Mc Nabb in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 44.7 mm.

***Severe Weather Warnings.* In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.**

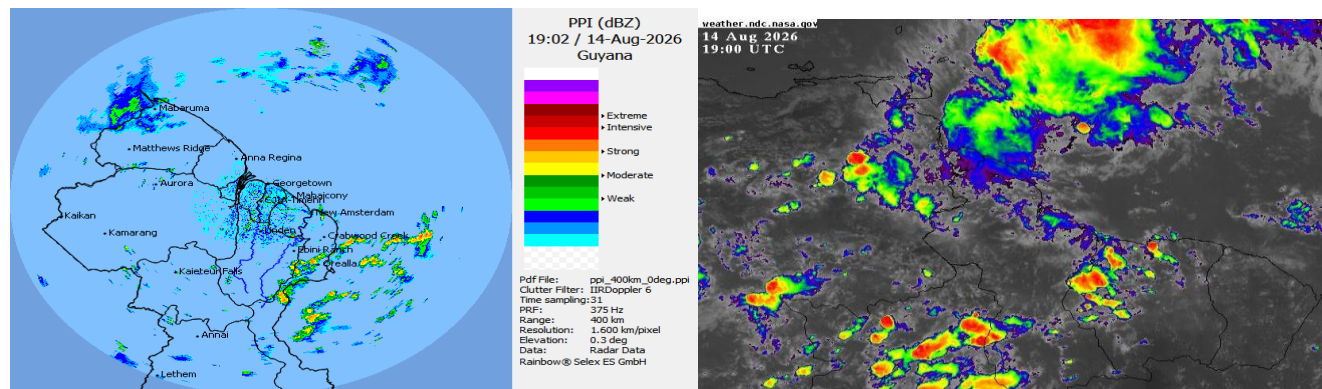
Marine Advisory: Spring tides coupled with high-energy waves will likely create dangerous sea conditions and possible overtopping and damage to river and sea defences. All marine users should remain on high alert, and persons living in low-lying coastal and riverine areas should take all necessary precautions.

Synopsis: *A tropical wave embedded within a low-pressure system affected Regions 1 to 3 and 7 throughout the day and is expected to affect Regions 1 and 7 throughout the evening hours. Mild instabilities were observed over Region 4 as a result of the above-mentioned Tropical wave. Elsewhere, mostly stable conditions were experienced throughout the morning. However, diurnal heating continued to produce instabilities over Inland areas during the afternoon. Another wave is expected on Sunday and will likely affect Regions 1 to 3 and 7. Mostly stable conditions are likely to persist over Regions 3 to 6 and 8 to 10 from Monday. Regions 1, 2, 7 will likely experience isolated pockets of convection during the afternoon due to localized diurnal heating.*

Today's weather review: *Scattered showers and thundershowers were observed over Regions 1 to 3 and 7. Elsewhere, fair and sunny skies.*

SEA CONDITIONS: MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTH-EASTERLY SWELLS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.5 TO 2.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 8 AND 9 SECONDS. MODERATE TO FRESH EASTERLY TO SOUTH-EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Sunday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers, rain, and thundershowers can be expected over Regions 1 to 3 and 7. Regions 4 to 6 and 10 can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers during the morning, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 and 40.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over Regions 1 to 3 and 7. All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies.**

Monday through Thursday: Partly cloudy, sunny, and hazy skies likely to persist over Coastal Regions 3 to 6 and Regions 6 to 10, with no significant rainfall expected. Inland areas along Regions 1 to 4 and 7 can expect fair and sunny skies during the morning, with cloudy skies accompanied by isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers likely from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 0.0 mm to 15.0 mm over Inland areas along Regions 1 to 5, 7, and 10, within 24 hours.**
