WEATHER BRIEF for today Friday, 06 February 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Friday, February 6, 2026, were available for most stations.

Track- F-Bydarabu in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 18.0 mm.


Marine advisory: Spring tides coupled with high-energy waves will likely create dangerous sea conditions and possible overtopping and damage to river and sea defences. All marine users should remain on high alert, and persons living in low-lying coastal and riverine areas should take all necessary precautions.

Synopsis: Stable conditions continued over the forecast area. Dry air from the low to upper levels is the dominant feature, as analyzed over Guyana. The Saharan Air Layer (SAL) is also active over Northern Guyana and contributing to these conditions. A slight increase in low-level moisture is expected on Monday and will likely produce mild instabilities over parts of Northern Guyana. Stable conditions are expected to continue from Tuesday.

Today's weather review: Partly cloudy to fair and sunny skies were observed over Guyana.

Extended Forecast

Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday: Partly cloudy to sunny skies can be expected over Coastal and Southern Guyana, with no significant rainfall expected. Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers varying from light to moderate can be expected over Inland and Southern Guyana during the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to range between 0.0 mm and 10.0 mm within 24 hours.

Monday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with fair and sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers varying from light to moderate can be expected over Inland and Southern Guyana during the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 20.0 mm.
