WEATHER BRIEF for today Wednesday, 18 February 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Wednesday, February 18, 2026, were available for most stations.

Fort Island in Region 03 recorded the highest rainfall of 12.4 mm.


Marine advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: The ridge of high pressure coupled with the Saharan Air Layer (SAL) are the dominant synoptic features affecting Guyana. These features are expected to remain for the rest of the week and continue into the week. The stabilizing effect from these systems will likely see generally dry conditions over most of Guyana. Meteorological models are indicating with moderate confidence that areas over Southern Guyana will experience mild to moderate instabilities during the aforementioned period above. Localized conditions can also produce isolated pockets of instabilities over Inland areas of Regions 1 to 4.

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with moderate showers were observed over Inland areas along Regions 1, 6 and 7. All remaining areas observed partly cloudy and sunny skies.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY SWELLS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 2.0 TO 2.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 7 AND 8 SECONDS. GENTLE TO MODERATE EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Friday through Tuesday: Partly cloudy to sunny skies with brief isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with mostly sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Rainfall is not expected to be significant over these areas. Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers varying from light to moderate can be expected over Inland and Southern Guyana during the afternoon. Rainfall is not expected to exceed 20.0 mm over Inland and Southern Guyana, within 24 hours.
