WEATHER BRIEF for today Saturday, 10 January 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Saturday, January 10, 2026, were available for most stations.

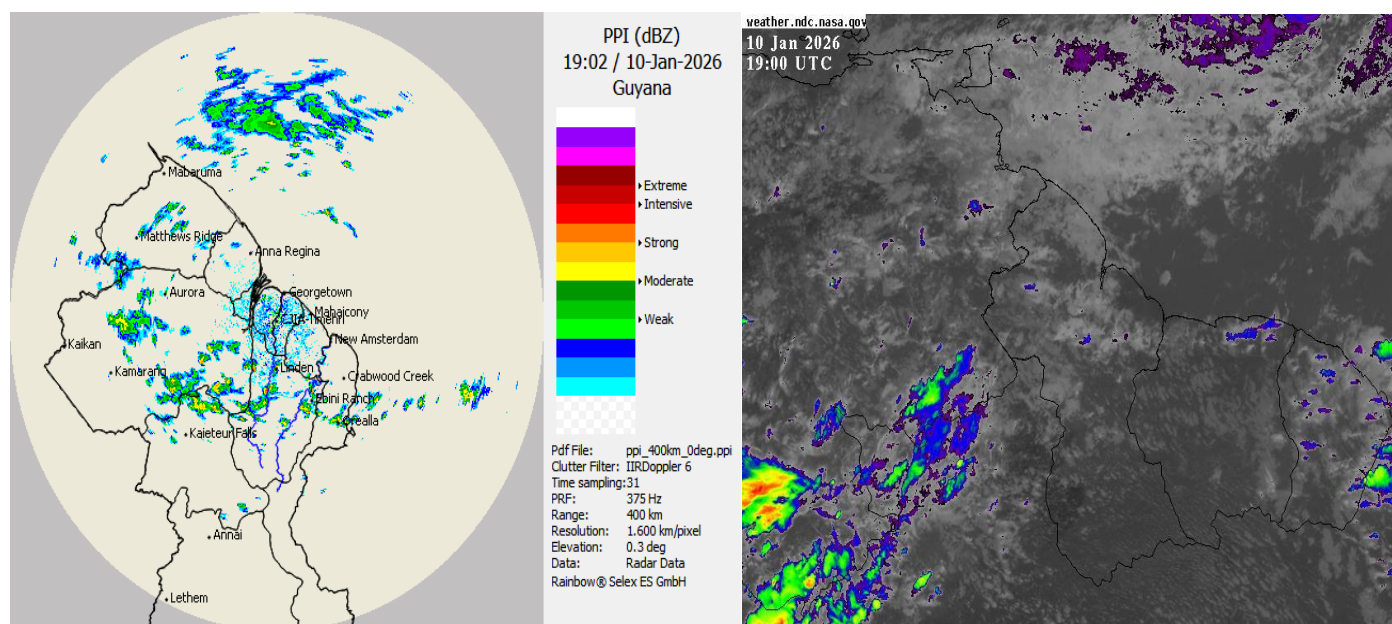
Hogg Island in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 49.6 mm.

Synopsis: *Mild to moderate instabilities continued over Northern Guyana, especially over Regions 1, 2, 6, and 7. Low-level troughing, embedded within moisture plumes are mostly responsible for these instabilities. This pattern is likely to continue over these areas over the next 12 hours and into the new week. The presence of clouds with significant vertical extent is not expected, as mid-to-upper level shearing is also prevalent over the forecast area.*

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with light to moderate showers and rain were observed over Region 1 and Inland areas along Regions 4 to 7 and 10. Elsewhere, partly cloudy to sunny skies.

Extended Forecast

Monday through Wednesday: Cloudy skies with scattered showers of varying intensities and periods of rain can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning. Conditions are expected to improve from the afternoon as partly cloudy skies will likely persist. Inland areas can expect cloudy to overcast skies with scattered showers of varying intensities and intermittent rain. ***Rainfall is expected to be between 15.0 mm and 45.0 mm within 24 hours.*** Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.

Thursday and Friday: Cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning with partly cloudy to sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities can be expected over Inland Guyana during the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to be between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm within 24 hours. Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.
