WEATHER BRIEF for today Tuesday, 13 January 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service,
Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Tuesday, January 13, 2026, were available for most stations.

Hossororo in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 24.2 mm.

Synopsis: *Mild to moderate instabilities continued over Northern Guyana, especially over Regions 1, 2, 6, 7, and 8. Low-level troughing, embedded within moisture plumes, is mostly responsible for these instabilities. This pattern is likely to continue for the remainder of the week, with dry and stable conditions expected over the weekend. Region 9 will continue to experience stable conditions.*

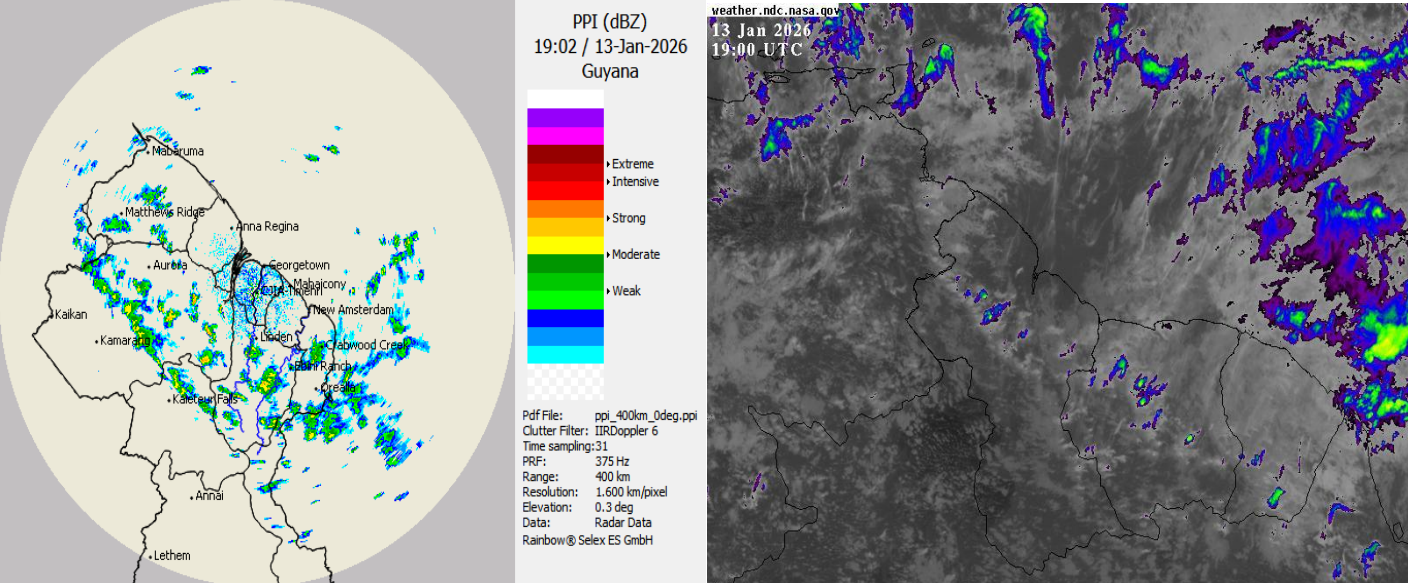
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with light to moderate showers and rain were observed over Region 1 and Inland areas along Regions 4 to 7 and 10. Elsewhere, partly cloudy to sunny skies.

Extended Forecast

Thursday through Saturday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers varying from light to moderate, and periods of rain can be expected over Coastal Regions 3 to 5 during the morning. Conditions are expected to improve from the afternoon as partly cloudy skies will likely persist. Regions 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, and 10 can expect cloudy to overcast skies with scattered showers of varying intensities and intermittent rain. **Rainfall is expected to range between 15.0 mm and 45.0 mm within 24 hours.** Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.

Sunday and Monday: Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning with fair and sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers, intensities can be expected over Inland Guyana during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm within 24 hours.** Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.
