WEATHER BRIEF for today Monday, 19 January 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Monday, January 19, 2026, were available for most stations.

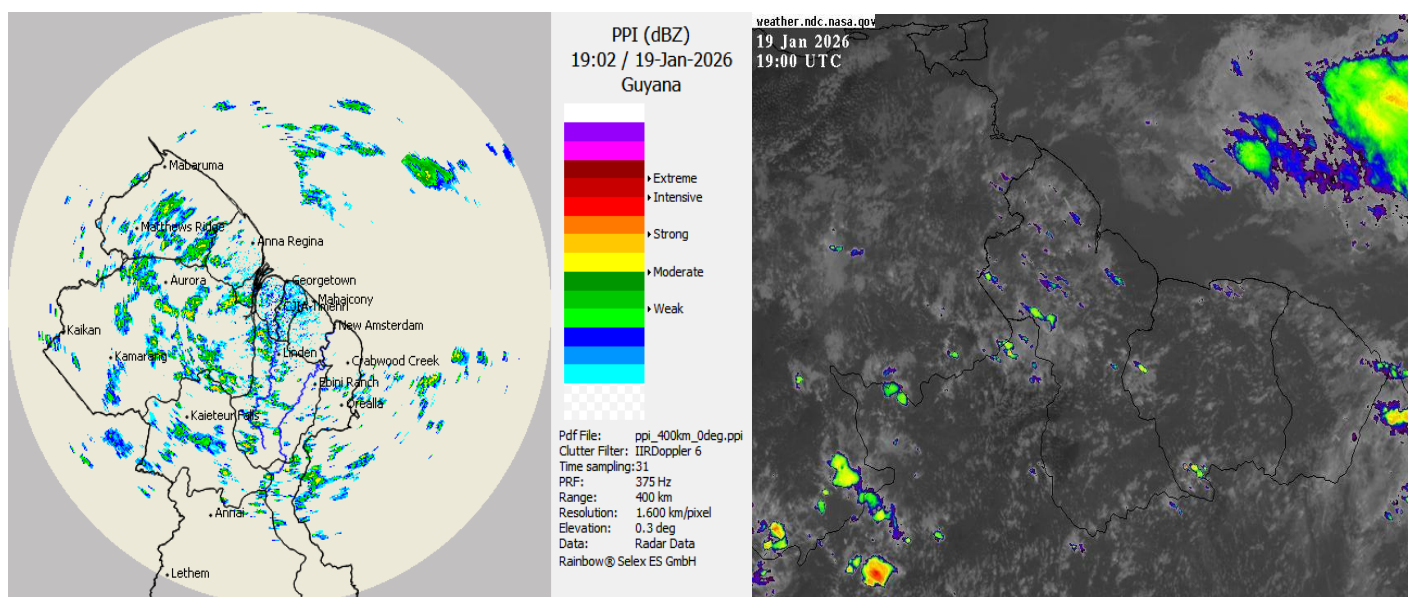
Pairfeit Harmony Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 53.9 mm.

Synopsis: *Region 1 and Inland areas along Regions 1 to 5 continue to experience mild to moderate instabilities. Low-level troughs embedded within moisture plumes are still the features of interest, creating these conditions. This is expected to continue into the evening hours and will likely affect Regions 7 and 8. Similar conditions are expected Tomorrow and for the remainder of the week. Mid to upper-level dynamics will continue to hinder the development of clouds with significant vertical extent, as they are highly sheared and will continue to be into the new week. Isolated pockets of mild convection are expected elsewhere.*

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with light to moderate showers and rain were observed over Region 1 and Inland areas. Elsewhere, partly cloudy skies.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY COMES INTO EFFECT FROM TOMORROW, JANUARY 17, 2026. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTHEASTERLY WAVES REACHING HEIGHTS OF 2.0 TO 2.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 8 AND 9 SECONDS. MODERATE EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday through Saturday: *Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with fair and sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers, with varying intensities, can be expected over Inland Guyana during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 40.0 mm within 24 hours.** Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.*
