**WEATHER BRIEF for today Saturday, 24 January 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana**





*Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Saturday, January 24, 2026, were available for most stations.*

***Maria's Pleasure in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 49.4 mm.***

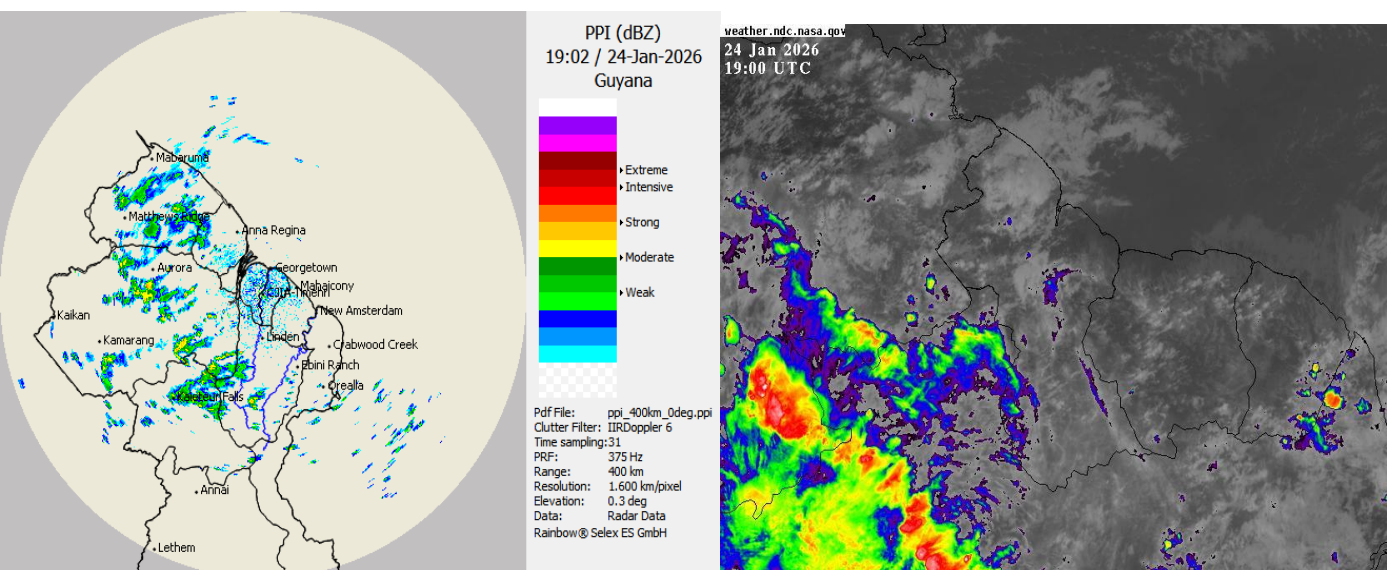
***Marine advisory: Moderate to rough seas, leading to hazardous sea conditions. All marine users, including seagoers, are asked to exercise caution during this time.***

**Synopsis:** Low-level troughs embedded within shallow moisture plumes remain the active features of interest affecting areas over Northern Guyana. Localized conditions and daytime heating are also producing mild to moderate instabilities over Inland areas. These instabilities are likely to continue into the evening hours. Regions 4 to 10 will likely experience more unstable conditions as we enter the new week, as a trough system seen at the 850 and 700 mb levels, respectively, coupled with favorable upper-level dynamics, will become the major feature of interest. Stable conditions are expected to return from Thursday.

***Today's weather review: Isolated showers were observed over Inland Guyana.***

**SEA CONDITIONS: MODERATE TO ROUGH SEAS WITH NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY SWELLS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 2.0 TO 3.0 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 10 AND 11 SECONDS. MODERATE TO FRESH EASTERLY BREEZE.**

### *Extended Forecast*

***Monday through Wednesday: Cloudy skies with scattered showers and periods of rain can be expected over regions 1 to 10. Coastal Guyana can expect improvements during the afternoon period. Rainfall is expected to range between 15.0 mm and 50.0 mm within 24 hours.***

**Thursday and Friday:** Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with fair and sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers, with varying intensities, can be expected over Inland Guyana during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 20.0 mm within 24 hours.** Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.
