WEATHER BRIEF for today Thursday, 29 January 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Thursday, January 29, 2026, were available for most stations.

Karawab in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 82.8 mm.

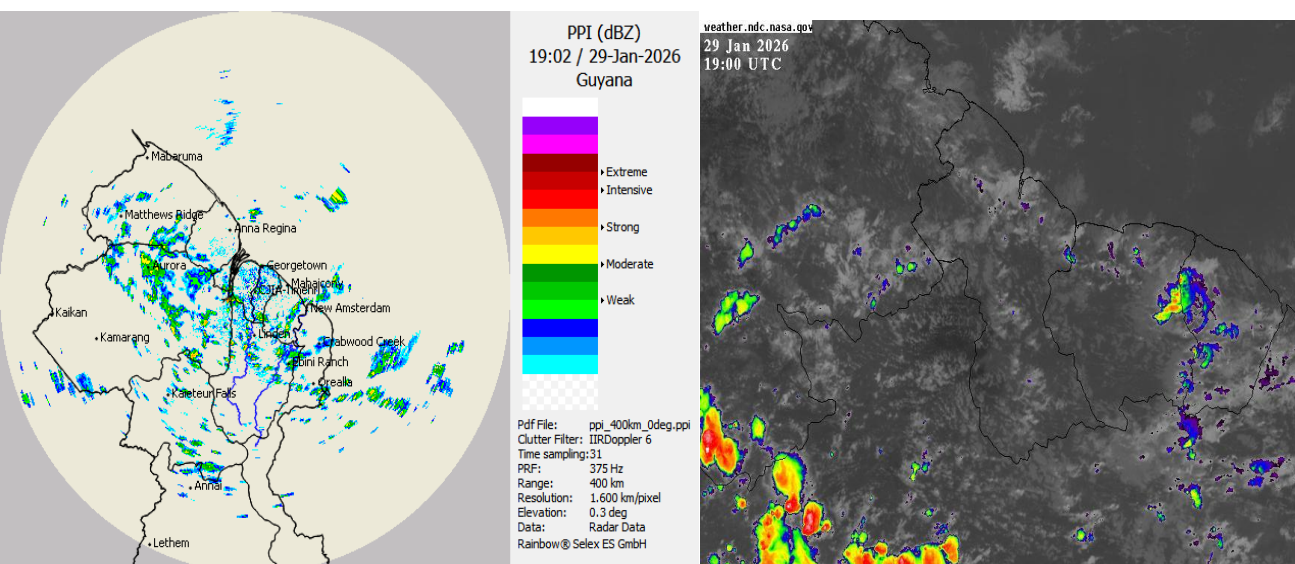
Marine advisory: Moderate to strong surface winds coupled with long-period swells are creating rough and dangerous sea conditions. Fisherfolk, small-vessel operators, and other marine users should remain on high alert and take all necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: *The atmospheric conditions over most of Northern Guyana continue to be driven by low-level moisture convergence and upper-level divergence. This pattern is not expected to change for the next 12 to 48 hours. Stable conditions are likely to be the new pattern from Sunday as a dry air mass moves into the forecast area. Nevertheless, localized conditions can produce isolated pockets of instability in Inland and mountainous areas.*

Today's weather review: *Isolated to scattered showers were observed over Inland Guyana.*

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY WILL BE IN EFFECT FROM TOMORROW AFTERNOON. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY SWELLS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 2.0 TO 2.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 15 AND 16 SECONDS. MODERATE TO FRESH EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Saturday: *Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with fair and sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers, with varying intensities, can be expected over Inland Guyana during the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm. Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies, with no significant rainfall.*

Sunday through Wednesday: Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with fair and sunny skies likely to persist from the afternoon. Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers varying from light to moderate can be expected over Inland Guyana during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 20.0 mm within 24 hours.** Southern Guyana can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies, with no significant rainfall.
