## WEATHER BRIEF for today Friday, 04 July 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Friday, July 4, 2025, were available for most stations.


Dagg Point in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 82.3 mm.

<u>Synopsis:</u> Moisture convergence from the ITCZ is the dominant feature affecting the forecast area. This pattern is expected to continue over Inland and Southern Guyana throughout the night. Coastal Guyana can expect mild to moderate instabilities during the morning hours. This pattern is expected to continue into the new week. Tropical wave #10 is expected on Tuesday and will affect Northern Guyana.

<u>Today's weather review</u>: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers were observed over most of Guyana.


Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall, for the next 10 days from July 04 to July 13, 2025, is 10.3 mm per day.

<u>SEA CONDITIONS:</u> SLIGHT TO MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTHEASTERLY SEAS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.0 TO 1.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 7 AND 8 S. MODERATE NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY WINDS.

## **Extended Forecast**

<u>Sunday through Thursday:</u> Cloudy skies with scattered showers can be expected over Regions 3 to 5 during the morning, with partly cloudy to fair and sunny skies expected from the afternoon. Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10 can expect cloudy to overcast skies with scattered showers of varying intensities and continuous rain from the afternoon. Isolated thundershowers are also likely over Regions 1, 6, 7, 8, and 9. Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 50.0 mm over Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10 and between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm elsewhere, within 24 hours.
