WEATHER BRIEF for today Saturday, 04 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Saturday, July 4, 2026, were available for most stations.

Kamarang in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 90.0 mm

Severe Weather Warnings. In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: Low level trough embedded with the ITCZ are the dominant features of interest affecting Northern Guyana. Elsewhere, low level moisture convergence and favourable upper-level dynamics are producing mild to moderate instabilities. Low level forcings are expected to continue over Regions 1, 2, 6 to 10 throughout the evening hours with morning convection expected over Regions 3 to 5. This pattern is expected to continue for most of the week, with two new tropical waves expected during the week. This will likely lead to a more unstable atmosphere over Guyana.

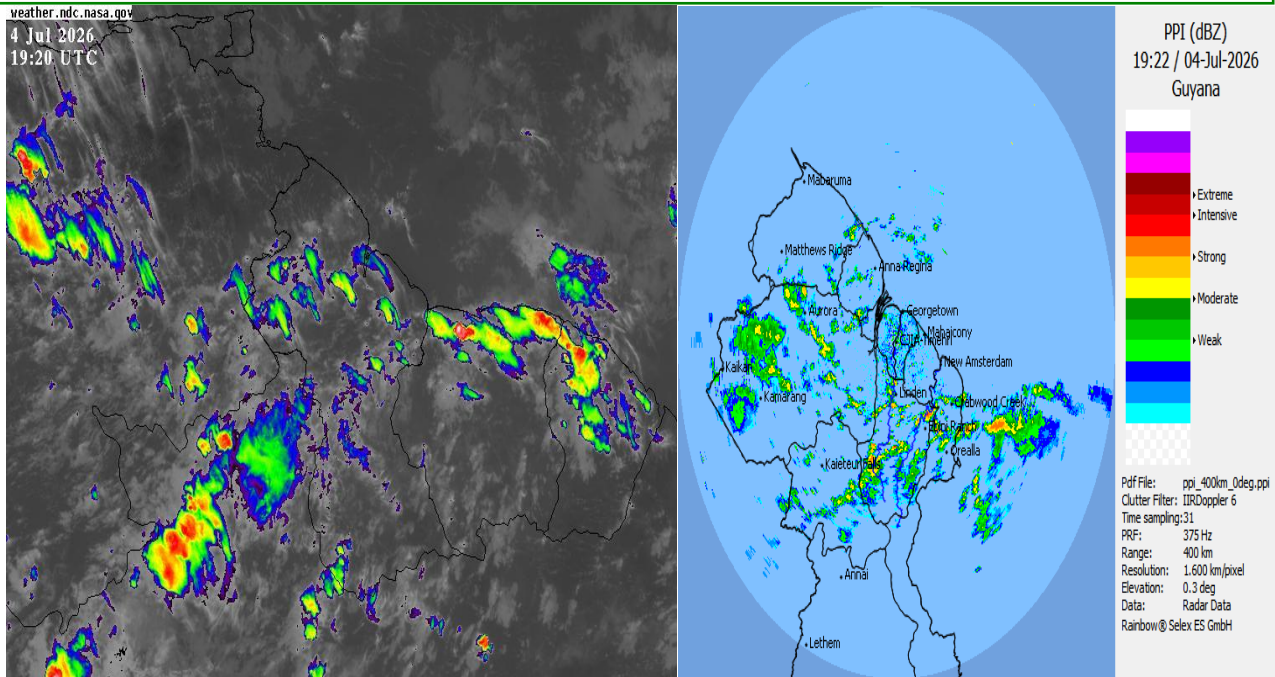
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers were observed over Regions 1, 2 and 9.

Extended Forecast

Monday through Wednesday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 3 to 5 during the morning hours. Improvements are expected from the afternoon as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. Regions 1, 2, 6, Inland areas and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy to overcast skies with scattered showers, intermittent rain and thundershowers. **Rainfall is expected to range between 15.0 mm and 60.0 mm over Regions 1, 2, 6, Inland and Southern Guyana and between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm over Coastal Regions 3 to 5, within 24 hours.**

Thursday and Friday: Cloudy skies with light to moderate showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 3 to 5 during the early morning hours. Improvements are expected from the mid-morning as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. All remaining areas can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 35.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected in areas with thundershowers.**
