WEATHER BRIEF for today Wednesday, 08 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Wednesday, July 8, 2026, were available for most stations.

Johanna South in Region 6 recorded the highest rainfall of 75.8 mm.

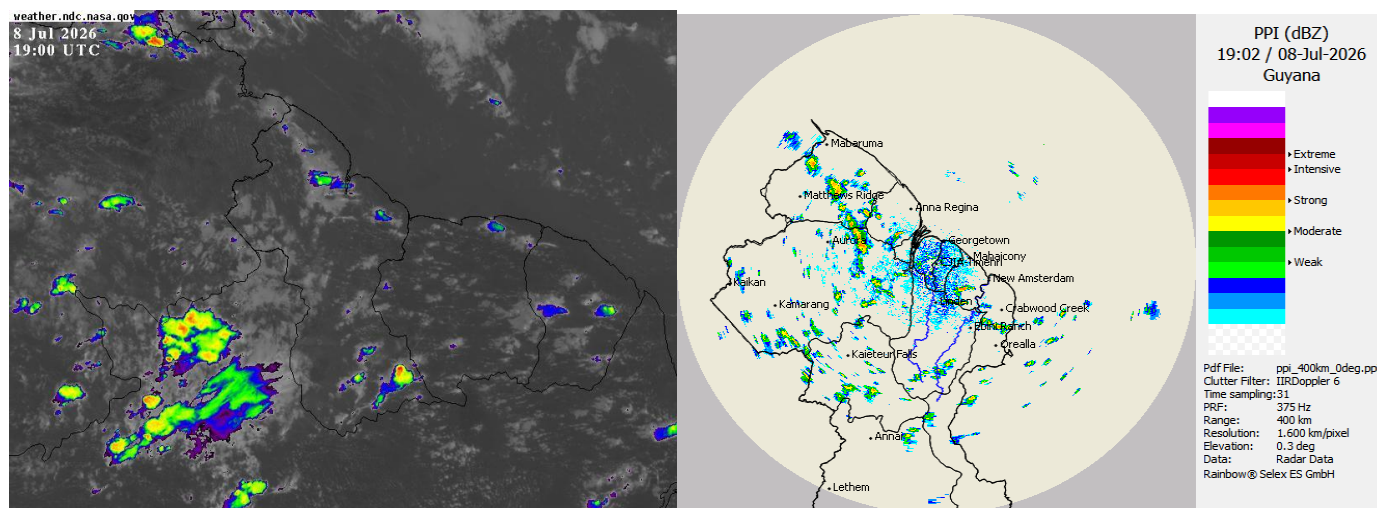
***Severe Weather Warnings.* In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.**

Synopsis: Tropical wave #24 exited Northern Guyana. Trailing instabilities created mild to moderate instabilities over Regions 1, 2, and 7. Inland areas along Regions 3 to 6 and 9 also experienced mild to moderate instabilities as moisture convergence was evident over these areas. Elsewhere, mostly stable conditions were observed. Meteorological models are indicating that these instabilities are likely to continue over Regions 1, 2, 7, and parts of Region 9 throughout the evening hours. Coastal Guyana will also experience mild to moderate convection during the morning. Tropical wave #25 is expected to affect areas over Regions 1 to 5 and 7 from Friday morning and continue as the day progresses. Generally stable conditions are expected for the weekend.

Today's weather review: *Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers were observed over Inland areas along Regions 1 to 7.*

Extended Forecast

Friday: Cloudy skies with scattered showers, rain, and isolated thundershowers can be expected over 1 to 7 and 10. Coastal Regions can expect these conditions during the morning period with improvements expected during the late afternoon. All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated showers during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 20.0 mm and 60.0 mm over Regions 1 to 7 and 10, with the highest expected over Regions 1, 2, and 7. Elsewhere, rainfall is not expected to be significant.**

Saturday through Tuesday: Cloudy skies with light to moderate showers can be expected over Coastal Regions during the early morning hours. Improvements are expected from mid-morning as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. All remaining areas can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 5.0 mm to 35.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest amounts in areas with thundershowers.**
