WEATHER BRIEF for today Thursday, 10 July 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Thursday, July 10, 2025, were available for most stations.

Richmond Hill in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 61.6 mm.

Severe Weather Warning: In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Marine Advisory: Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding, as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: The ITCZ is the major feature of interest. Moisture plumes within the ITCZ are producing moderate instabilities over Inland and Hinterland Guyana. Mild instabilities are also experienced over Coastal Guyana. This pattern is expected to continue into this evening and for the remainder of the week. Meteorological Models are indicating that on Sunday, mostly mild instabilities are expected over Inland areas while generally stable conditions are expected over Coastal Regions. Monday and onwards, mostly unstable conditions are likely to prevail for most of the forecast area.

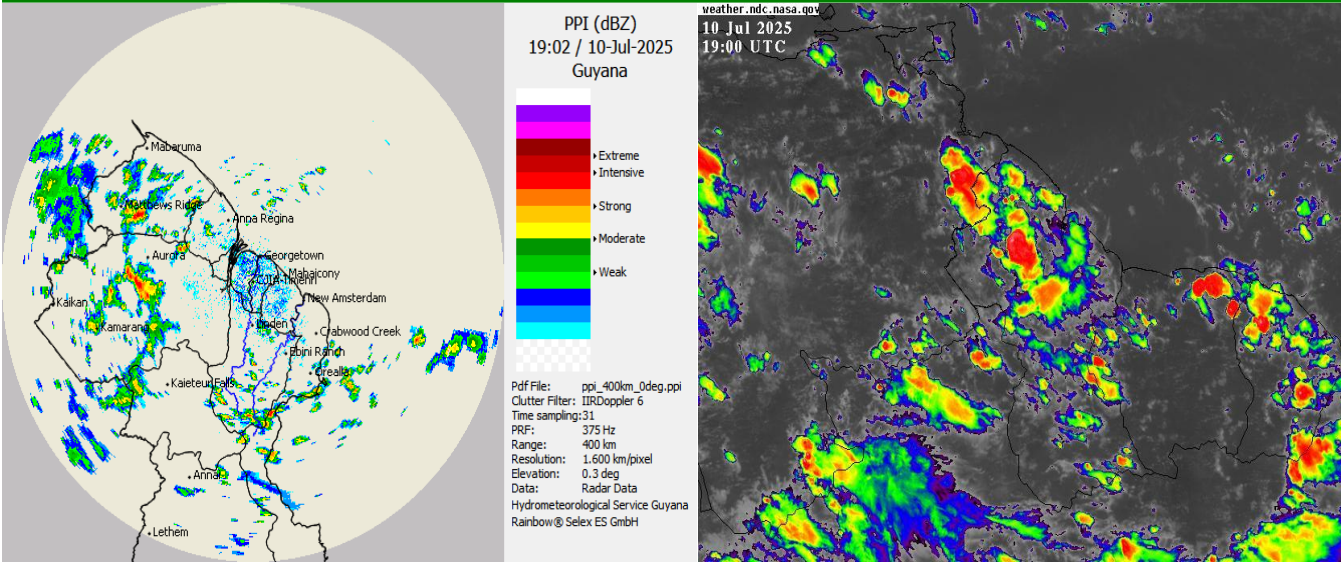
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with scattered showers and thundershowers were observed over Inland and Southern Guyana. Partly cloudy skies elsewhere.

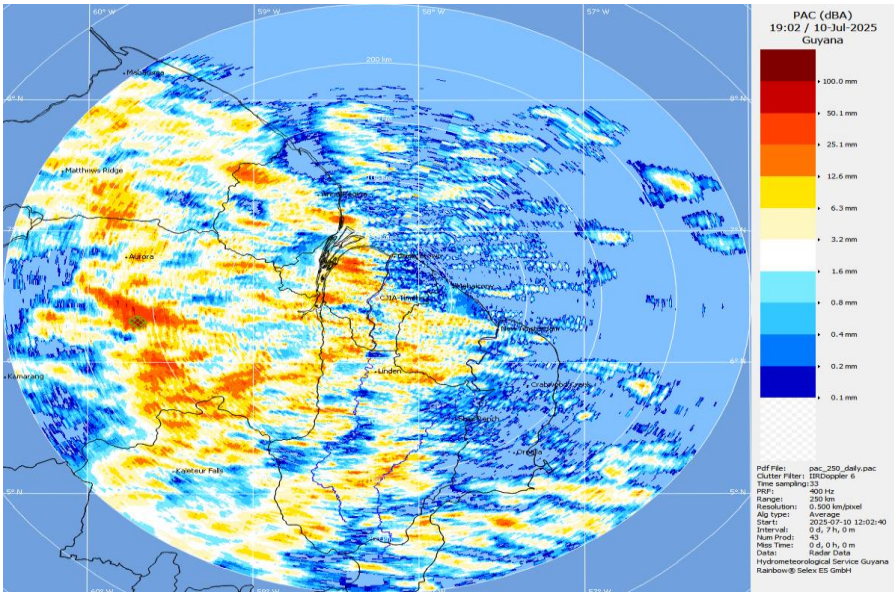
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall, for the next 10 days from July 10 to July 20, 2025, is 8.7 mm per day.

Extended Forecast

Saturday, Monday and Tuesday: Cloudy skies becoming overcast at times, with scattered to frequent showers of varying intensities can be expected over most of Guyana. Regions 2 to 5 can expect these conditions during the morning hours, with improvements expected from the afternoon. Isolated to scattered thundershowers are also likely over Regions 1 and 6 to 10. **Rainfall is expected to range between 25.0 mm and 75.0 mm, within 24 hours.**

Sunday and Wednesday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning hours, with fair and sunny skies expected from mid-morning. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers from the afternoon. Isolated thundershowers are also likely over these areas. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm.**
