WEATHER BRIEF for today Friday, 18 July 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Friday, July 18, 2025, were available for most stations.

Wowetta in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 48.9 mm.

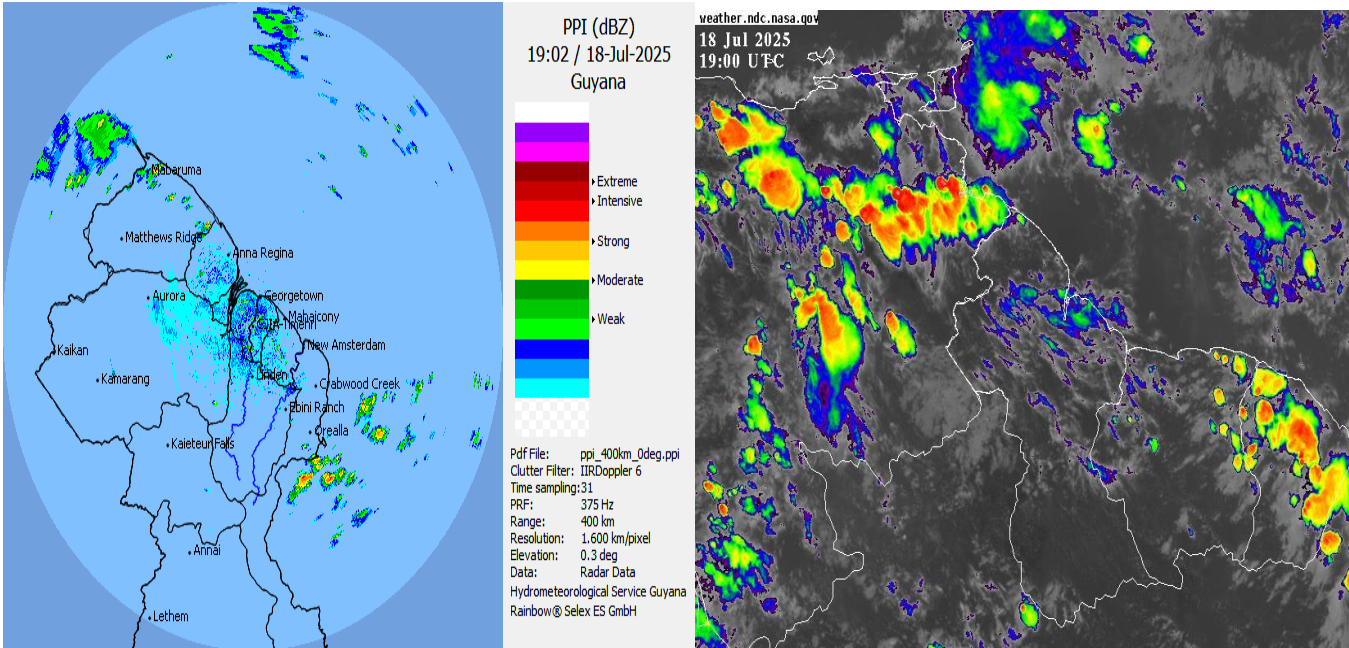
Severe Weather Warning: In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: *The ITCZ is meandering over Northern Guyana. During the day, it was located to the North of Guyana and is expected to move over Coastal Guyana during the early morning. The oscillation of this system will likely lead to periods of stability and periods of convection during the next 3 to 4 days over Northern Guyana. Meanwhile, Southern Guyana will likely experience mild to moderate instabilities for the next 12 to 48 hours, after which generally stable conditions will likely continue. Stable conditions are expected over most of the forecast area from Thursday.*

Today's weather review: *Partly cloudy to sunny skies were observed over most of the forecast area.*

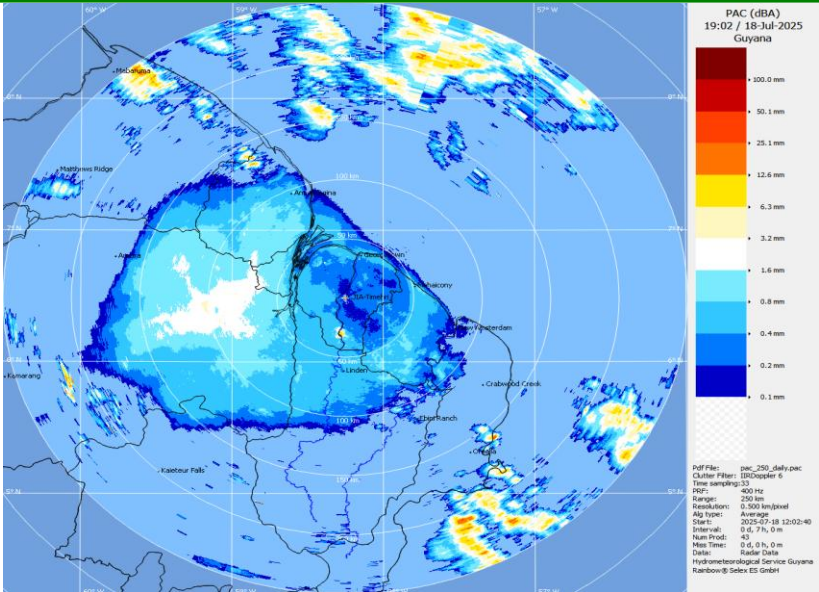
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall, for the next 10 days from July 18 to July 27, 2025, is 7.5 mm per day.

Extended Forecast

Sunday through Wednesday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning hours, with partly cloudy and sunny skies expected from the afternoon. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers from the early afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 45.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over areas with thundershowers.***

Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over most of the forecast area. Coastal Guyana can expect these conditions during the morning hours, with the remainder of the country likely to experience these conditions from the afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to range between 4.0 mm and 20.0 mm.***
