WEATHER BRIEF for today Tuesday, 22 July 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Tuesday, July 22, 2025, were available for most stations.

De Edwards in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 46.4 mm.

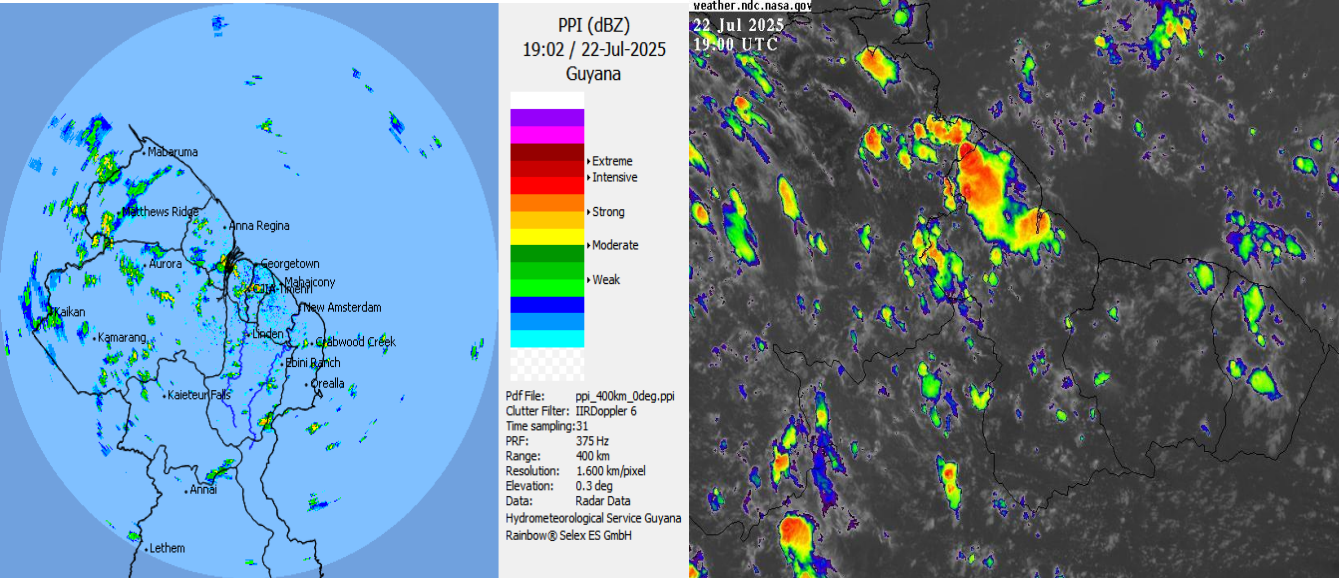
Severe Weather Warning: In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: Tropical wave #13 is currently creating mild to moderate instabilities over Northern Guyana, especially over Inland areas. This system is expected to continue to affect these areas for the next 12 to 24 hours. Southern Guyana will also continue to experience mild to moderate instabilities.

Today's weather review: *Cloudy skies with scattered showers and thundershowers were observed over Inland areas. Partly cloudy to sunny skies were observed elsewhere.*

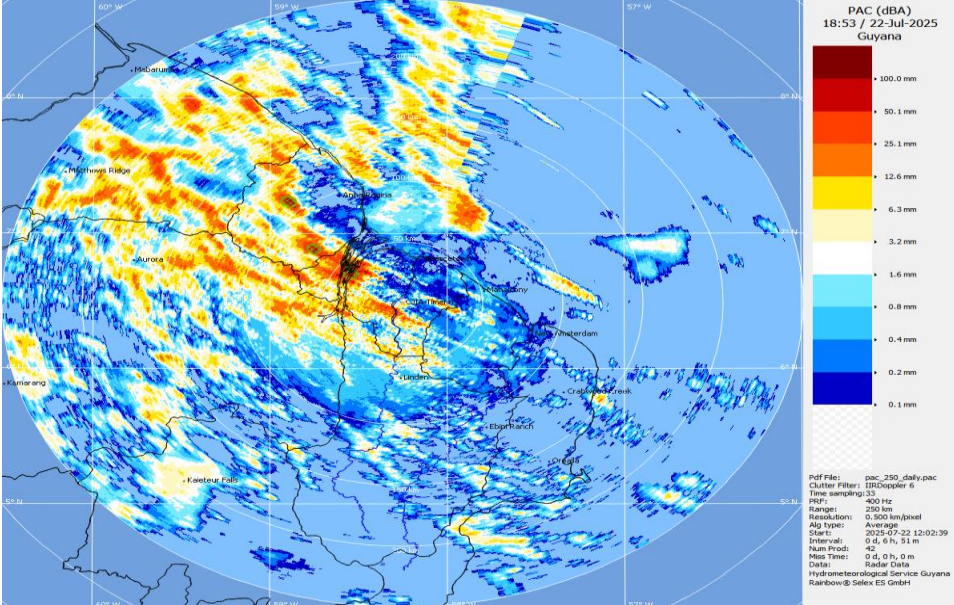
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall, for the next 10 days from July 22 to August 01, 2025, is 7.3 mm per day.

SEA CONDITIONS: SLIGHT SEAS WITH NORTH-EASTERLY SEAS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.0 TO 1.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 5 AND 6 S. GENTLE TO MODERATE EASTERLY TO SOUTH-EASTERLY WINDS.

Extended Forecast

Thursday and Monday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning hours, with partly cloudy and sunny skies expected from the afternoon. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers from the early afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 45.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over areas with thundershowers.***

Friday through Sunday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over most of the forecast area. Coastal Guyana can expect these conditions during the morning hours, with the remainder of the country likely to experience these conditions from the afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to range between 4.0 mm and 20.0 mm.***
