WEATHER BRIEF for today Wednesday, 22 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Wednesday, July 22, 2026, were available for most stations.

De Kinderen Back in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 85.9 mm.

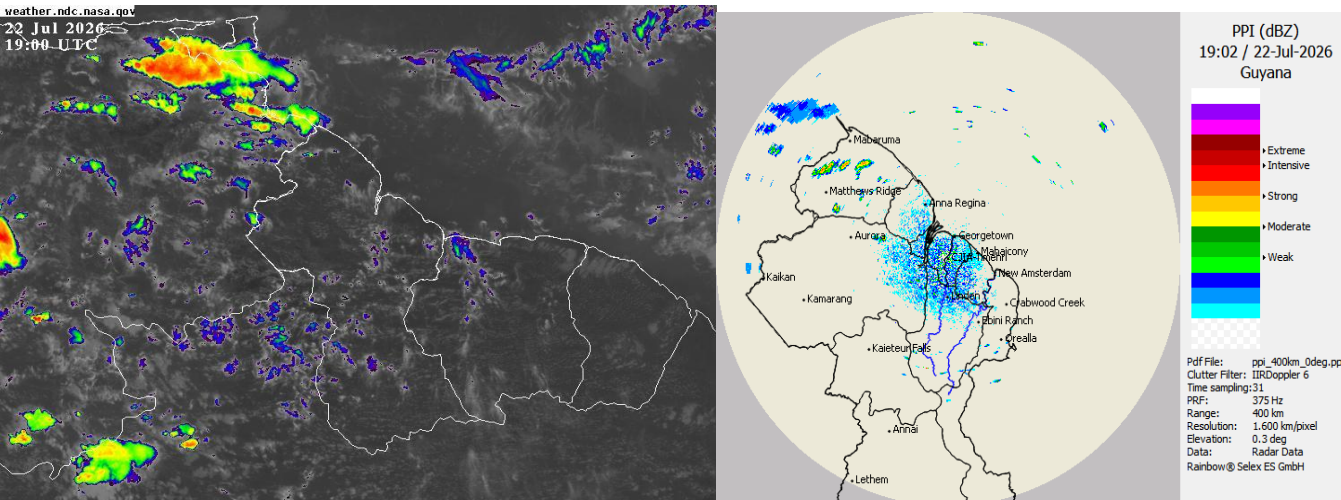
Severe Weather Warnings. In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: Mild to moderate instabilities from the Inter-tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) are affecting areas over Regions 1, 2 and 7. However, dry air is being driven into these areas by the Atlantic High-Pressure system. The ITCZ is expected to continue to meander over Regions 1 to 5 for the next 3 to 4 days. However, dry atmosphere at the 700 and 500 mb levels, respectively, is inhibiting any intense convective activity. Vertical shear is also a contributing factor, as it will aid in deterring any convection. Nevertheless, localized conditions can produce isolated to scattered instabilities over Inland areas along Regions 1 to 7 and 10, but mostly during the afternoon.

Today's weather review: Partly cloudy and sunny skies were observed over most of Guyana.

Extended Forecast

Friday through Tuesday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated showers varying from light to moderate showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 3 to 6 during the early morning hours. Improvements are expected from mid-morning as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. Regions 1, 2, 7, 8, and Inland areas can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and possible thundershowers from the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to range from 0.0 mm to 25.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest amounts expected in Regions 1, 2, 7, 8 and Inland areas. Region 9 can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies, with no significant rainfall expected.
