WEATHER BRIEF for today Saturday, 25 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Saturday, July 25, 2026, were available for most stations.

Arpiaco Creek in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 27.0 mm.

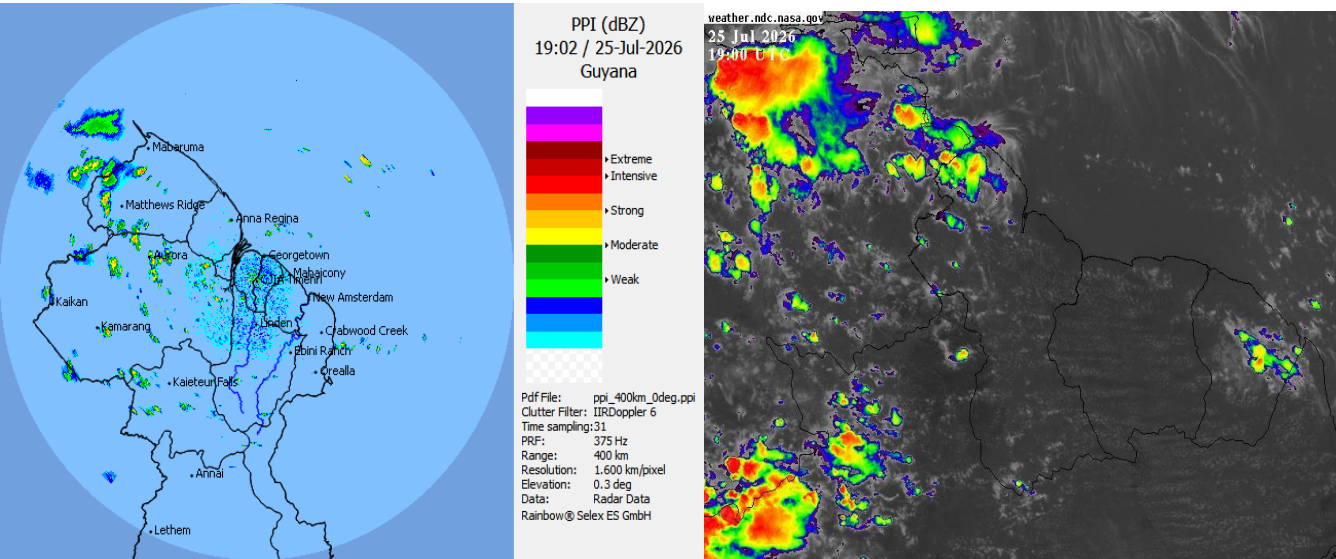
***Severe Weather Warnings.* In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.**

Synopsis: The passage of a Tropical wave during the early morning created mild instabilities over Regions 1 and 7. Elsewhere, a ridge pattern was analyzed, creating mostly stable conditions throughout the morning. During the afternoon, localized diurnal heating produced mild to moderate instabilities over Inland areas. Meteorological models are indicating that areas over Regions 1 to 3 and 7 will continue to observe scattered pockets of convection due to the meandering of the ITCZ. Inland areas will also observe afternoon instabilities. A tropical wave is expected on Tuesday and will likely enhance instabilities over areas in Northern Guyana. Stable conditions are expected from Wednesday and will continue for the remainder of the week.

***Today's weather review:** Partly cloudy and sunny skies were observed over Coastal and Southern Guyana. Elsewhere, isolated to scattered showers were observed.*

Extended Forecast

Monday and Tuesday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers, rain, and thundershowers can be expected over Regions 1 to 7 and 10. Coastal Regions will likely experience improvements in conditions from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 10.0 mm to 45.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected on Tuesday.** Regions 8 and 9 can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.

Wednesday through Friday: Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 3 to 5 during the morning period. Conditions are expected to improve from mid-morning as sunny skies will likely persist. Regions 1, 2, 6, 7, and Inland Guyana can expect cloudy skies with isolated showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 0.0 mm to 20.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest amounts in Regions 1, 2, 7, and 8, as well as in Inland areas.** Regions 8 and 9 can expect mostly sunny skies, with no significant rainfall expected.
