WEATHER BRIEF for today Tuesday, 28 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Tuesday, July 28, 2026, were available for most stations.

Abary MMA in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 58.8 mm.

Marine Advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding, as over-topping is likely.

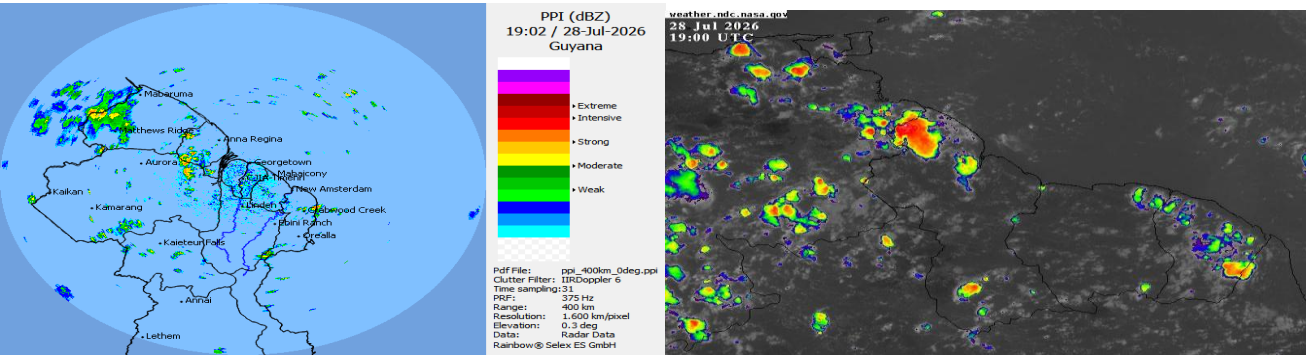
Severe Weather Warnings. In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: A tropical wave is analyzed over Northeastern Coast of Guyana. This wave is affecting areas over Regions 1, 2 and 7 and will continue to affect areas over Regions 1 and 7 as it continues to move westward. Inland areas along Regions 3 to 6 and 10 also experience mild to moderate instabilities from the early afternoon, as low level moisture convergence and localized conditions were the major cause of these activities. Elsewhere, no significant convection was experienced. Looking ahead, meteorological models are indicating Coastal Regions 2 to 6 will likely experience early morning pockets of low-level moisture which will likely see isolated showers over these areas after which stable conditions should prevail. Inland Guyana will also experience afternoon instabilities resulting in mild to moderate convection. Another Tropical wave is expected on Thursday but will likely affect Regions 1 to 3 and 7 as it makes its passage over these areas. Friday and into the weekend, mostly dry and stable conditions are expected over most of Guyana.

Today's weather review: Partly cloudy and sunny skies were observed over Coastal and Southern Guyana. Elsewhere, isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers were observed.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: SLIGHT SEAS WITH NORTH-EASTERLY WAVES REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.0 TO 1.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 7 AND 8 SECONDS. GENTLE TO MODERATE EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Thursday: Cloudy skies with scattered showers, rain, and thundershowers can be expected over Regions 1 to 3 and 7. Regions 4 to 6 and 10 can expect light to moderate showers during the morning period with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. **Rainfall is expected to range from 10.0 mm to 50.0 mm, with the highest expected over Regions 1 to 3 and 7.** Regions 8 and 9 can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall expected.

Friday through Monday: Partly cloudy, hazy and sunny skies can be expected over Coastal and Southern Guyana, with no rainfall expected. Inland areas can expect fair and sunny skies during the morning with isolated showers and thundershowers likely from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range from 0.0 mm to 10.0 mm within 24 hours over Inland areas.**
