WEATHER BRIEF for today Wednesday, 03 June 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Wednesday, June 3, 2026, were available for most stations.





Bath Waterloo in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 75.8 mm.

Severe Weather Warnings: Soils are already saturated from continuous rainfall, and forecast conditions continue to indicate more rainfall amounts, which can increase the likelihood and severity of flooding in low-lying and poor drainage areas. Flooding is also likely to continue over Inland and Southern Guyana. Hilly areas can also expect possible mudslides during heavy downpours. In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Marine Advisory: Strong winds created moderate to rough waves, which will likely create dangerous sea conditions and damage to river and sea defences. All marine users should remain on high alert, and persons living in low-lying coastal and riverine areas should take all necessary precautions.

Synopsis: The ITCZ and Tropical wave # 9 were the dominant features over Regions 1, 2, and 7 throughout the day. However, the wave was surrounded by a relatively dry environment, resulting in light to moderate precipitation. Areas over Southern Region 6 continued to experience low-level forcings during the afternoon, which continued to create mild to moderate convection. This is expected to move further Inland throughout the evening hours and affect areas over Regions 8 to 10. Meteorological models indicate that for the next 12 to 48 hours, Coastal Regions 3 to 5 will likely experience mild to moderate convection due to the ITCZ during the morning hours, after which generally stable conditions will prevail. Tropical wave #10 is expected to affect Regions 1 to 5 and 7 from Saturday morning and likely continue for the remainder of the day. The ITCZ is expected to become more prominent from Saturday night into Sunday, resulting in more rainfall over these areas. Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10 will continue to experience mild to moderate convection for the remainder of the week and into the weekend. Stable conditions are expected from Monday over most of Northern Guyana.

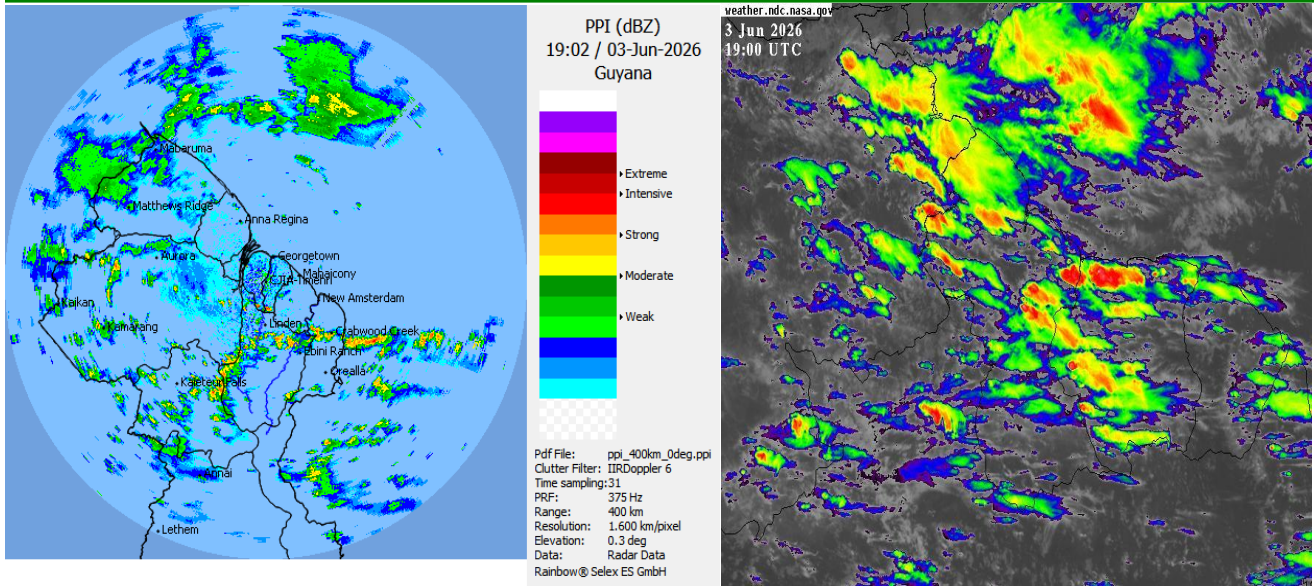

Extended Forecast

Friday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and rain can be expected over Regions 3 to 5 during the morning hours. Improvements are expected this afternoon as partly cloudy skies are likely to persist. Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10 can expect cloudy to overcast skies with scattered to frequent showers, thundershowers, and rain. **Rainfall is expected to range between 20.0 mm and 50.0 mm over Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10, and elsewhere between 5.0 mm and 20.0 mm.**

Saturday and Sunday: Cloudy to overcast skies with scattered to frequent showers, rain, and thundershowers can be expected over Regions 1 to 7 and 10. Similar conditions can be expected over Regions 8 and 9, but from the afternoon hours. **Rainfall is expected to range between 20.0 mm and 80.0 mm within 24 hours.**

Monday and Tuesday: Cloudy skies with isolated showers and rain can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning hours. Improvements are expected from mid-morning as partly cloudy, sunny, and hazy skies will likely persist. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies with scattered showers and isolated thundershowers. **Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 35.0 mm over Inland and Southern Guyana and elsewhere between 0.0 mm and 10.0 mm, within 24 hours.**
