WEATHER BRIEF for today Sunday, 15 June 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Sunday, June 15, 2025, were available for most stations.





Richmond Hill in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 97.3 mm.

Severe Weather Warnings: *In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and possible lightning strikes will likely be observed. Persons should exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.*

Marine Advisory: Moderate to rough swells will likely result in hazardous sea conditions, overtopping and possible damage to vulnerable areas of the river and sea defence. Marine users are asked to take the necessary precautions.

Synopsis: Generally stable conditions were experienced over Coastal Guyana. Inland and Southern Guyana observed mild to moderate instabilities throughout the day. This is expected to continue into the night. Meteorological models are indicating that most of the instabilities will likely occur over Inland and Southern Guyana. Tropical wave #5 is expected to affect Northern Guyana from Wednesday.

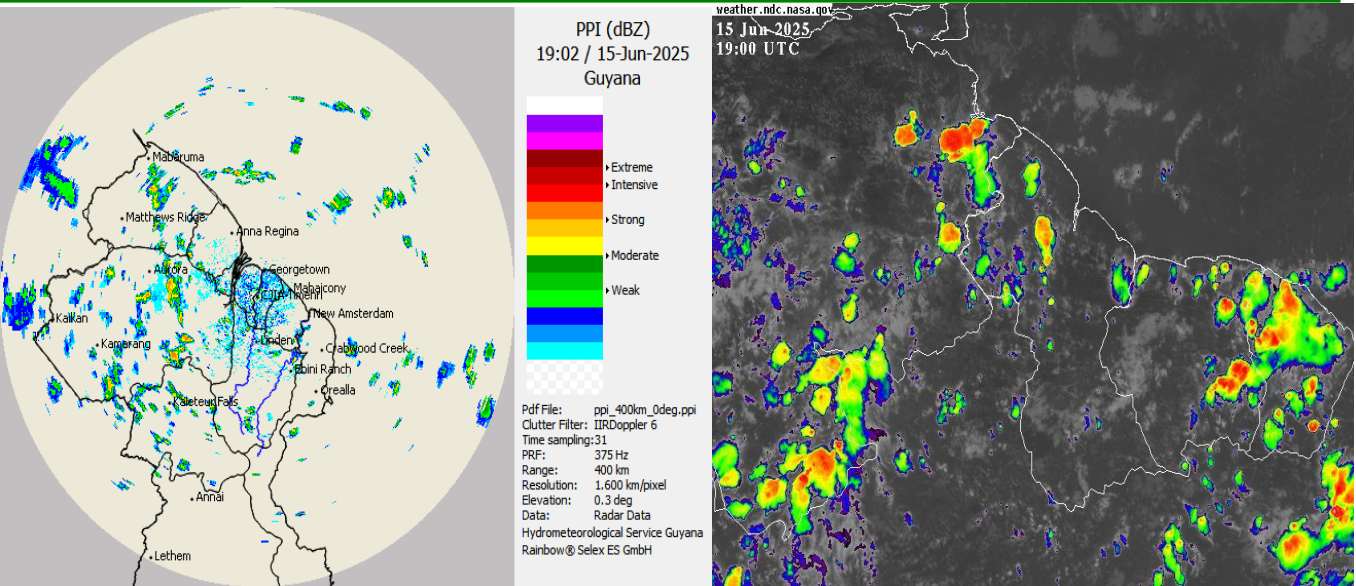
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers were observed over Regions 6, Southern Region 6, and Regions 8 and 9. Partly cloudy to fair and sunny skies elsewhere.

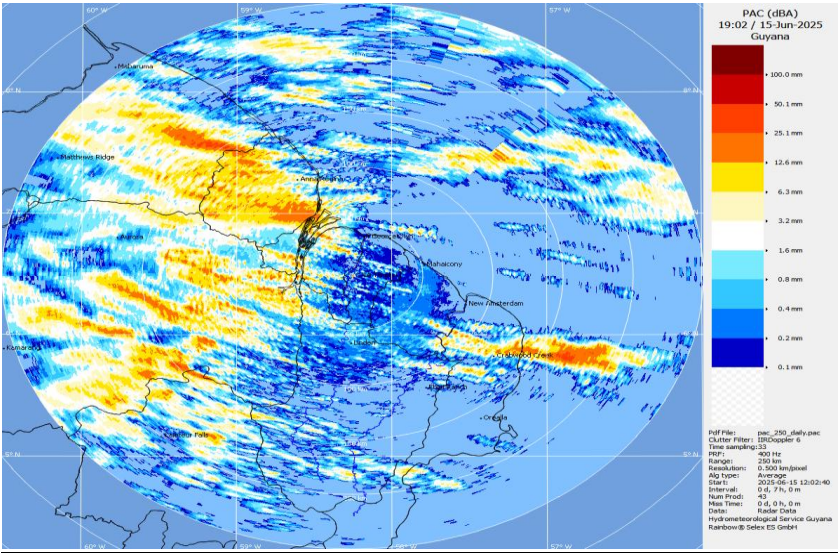
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall, for the next 10 days from June 15 to June 24, 2025, is 11.1 mm per day.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday and Wednesday: Coastal Guyana can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers during the morning hours, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon as partly cloudy to sunny skies will likely persist. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers from the afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 30.0 mm, within 24 hours.***

Thursday through Saturday: Coastal Guyana can expect mostly cloudy skies with scattered showers of varying intensities and intermittent rain during the morning hours, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon as partly cloudy to cloudy skies will likely persist. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers during the afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to range between 15.0 mm and 50.0 mm, within 24 hours.***
