WEATHER BRIEF for today Sunday, 01 March 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Sunday, March 1, 2026, were available for most stations.

Onderneeming in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 5.0 mm.

Dust Advisory: Mild concentrations of the Saharan Dust are still present over Guyana's Coastal Regions, resulting in hazy skies, reduced visibility, and poor air quality. People sensitive to changes in air quality are asked to take all necessary precautions.

Marine advisory: Spring tide coupled with moderate to rough seas will likely result in over-topping of sea defenses and create hazardous sea conditions. All marine users and persons in low-lying and riverine areas are asked to take the necessary precautions.

Synopsis: The Sub-tropical Ridge, coupled with mild concentrations of the Saharan Air Layer (SAL)/Saharan Dust are the most dominant feature of interest affecting the forecast area. Mostly dry and stable conditions are expected for the next 12 hours and will continue into the week. The concentrations of the Saharan Dust are expected to increase as the week progresses, and this will further add to the stability of the forecast area.



SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT UNTIL MARCH 07, 2026. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: MODERATE TO ROUGH SEAS WITH NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY WAVES REACHING HEIGHTS OF 2.5 TO 3.0 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 9 AND 10 SECONDS. MODERATE TO FRESH NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday through Saturday: Partly cloudy to sunny skies can be expected over Coastal Guyana. Rainfall is not expected to be significant over these areas. Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated showers, ranging from light to moderate, can be expected over Inland and Southern Guyana during the afternoon. ***Rainfall is not expected to exceed 15.0 mm over Inland and Southern Guyana, within 24 hours.***
